In some respects it is difficult to keep our focus on Christ amid the din of blaring riots and the noise of a heated election season. On the other hand, when you fix your attention on unchanging truth in a world that is rapidly shifting and transforming, the beauty of our God becomes more evident. It is wonderful to see the gospel going forward in times of difficulty, and sometimes as a result of difficulties, as people come to the end of their abilities, and God reveals to them a much deeper, spiritual need.

Along the same line, our hearts are burdened for friends and family in Iowa, as they pick up the pieces after the powerful storm of August 10th, which flattened 10 million acres of crops, snapped off trees and power lines, tore off roofs, and flipped semis on the roads.
