Essentia Health relaxing visitor restrictions

As the prevalence of COVID-19 declines across the region, Essentia Health is returning to pre-pandemic patient visitation in its hospitals and clinics.

Like many health systems, Essentia Health responded to the public health crisis in spring 2020 by limiting visitors to its facilities. This was done to protect patients, staff and the community.

As COVID-19 ebbed and flowed, policies were adjusted accordingly.


These changes are based on the availability of space in each of Essentia Health's units. Thus, visitors may still be limited in certain units.

Similarly, some restrictions remain in place at long-term care facilities. Contact the long-term care facility you're interested in for the most up-to-date information.

Essentia Health will continue to follow guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, as well as state departments of health. Masks are required among everyone within its facilities and all patients and visitors will still be screened for symptoms of COVID-19. Additionally, no outside food or beverages will be allowed.

Visitor restrictions remain in place for COVID-19 positive patients, as well as patients suspected to have COVID-19.

Donald Edward Kremer

Donald Edward Kremer passed away Sunday, June 27th, 2021, at his home on East Twin Lake in Pequot Lakes, MN. He was 82 years of age. He is survived by two sons: Ken and his wife Ruth Kremer of St. Michael, Minnesota and Kurt and his wife Melanie of Lakeville, Minnesota, and five grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his father and mother.

Born on February 7, 1939, in Wells, MN, Donald was the son of Lawrence Clement and Genevieve Ethilyn Bethania (Hobert) Kremer. He was third of 5 brothers and 2 sisters.

Don attended elementary school in Wells, Minnesota and graduated from Wells High School in 1957. In high school, he was active in football, basketball, track, W (sports) Club. He sang in the school choir, acted in school plays, and worked on the school paper.

In 1956, Don joined the Minnesota Army National Guard attached to the Albert Lea unit. He served 9 years and Honorable Discharged as a Platoon Sergeant First Class E7 while serving in Alaska.

In 1957, Don began his diverse career as a painter with his father's painting business "Kremer's Painting". He painted several houses throughout the years. He also worked for the Wells Post Office, as a salesman for the Jewel Tea Company, and as a machine operator for the Banquet Canning Company. Don married Arlyss E. Rollenhagen in 1960 in Wells, MN.

Don began his law enforcement career in 1963 as a deputy for the Freeborn County Sheriff's Department in Albert Lea, MN. He graduated from the Minnesota Highway Patrol Officers Candidate School in 1966 and was stationed at the Windom Patrol Office, Marshall District until 1983 when he transferred to the Staples and Brainerd office. He retired as a Station Sergeant from the Minnesota State Patrol in December of 1997.

He continued to work following his retirement, becoming Chief Security Officer of Madden's Resort in 1999. He also served as a part time Court Officer for the Crow Wing County District Court for 13 years and served civil process papers for area attorneys.

Don enjoyed flying as a private pilot of both Cessna and Cherokee aircraft along with walking, boating, motor home traveling, and working around the yard and home.

Services will be held at the Pequot Lakes Baptist Church on July 7th at 1pm. His grandsons Tanner, Ben, Charlie, Henry and Alex Kremer will serve as honorary pallbearers. Don's remains are interred at St. Casimir Cemetery. Arrangements made with the Brenny Funeral Home of Baxter, Minnesota.





Blood shortage spurs call for donations

Facing one of the worst blood shortages in recent memory, health care leaders are urging people to consider donating.

Already, the shortage has forced some hospitals across the country to delay elective surgeries. The situation is mainly fueled by the COVID-19 pandemic. Fewer people donated blood during the pandemic and there is a backlog of procedures after many were postponed due to COVID-19.

Supply is low for all blood types, even Type O-negative, which is especially concerning because of its universal acceptance; anyone can receive O-negative blood despite their blood type.

While Essentia Health has largely been able to navigate the shortage thus far without significant interruptions, the risk is pronounced.

"Severe shortages of blood components pose significant risk to normal hospital operations and could result in the delay of elective surgeries, thus disrupting crucial patient care," Dr. Maria Beaver, a pathologist and transfusion services medical director at Essentia Health, said in a news release. "In our experience, summer blood supply tends to be lower on average, and this is further heightened by the COVID pandemic. At the same time, summer months tend to bring a larger number of trauma cases, thus the need for blood increases. A healthy and continuous blood supply is crucial for normal operations and excellent patient care."

"We strongly encourage healthy people to consider the gift of donation to replenish the blood supply both within and outside our region," Beaver said.

It's said that every two seconds in the U.S. someone will need blood. And blood from one donation can save up to three lives. Donation opportunities abound.

Visit aabb.org/for-donors-patients/give-blood to find the blood-donation center, as well as upcoming blood drives, nearest you.

To be eligible to donate blood, you must be 17 years old (16 with parental consent), weigh at least 110 pounds and be in good health.

Two local blood drives scheduled

The American Red Cross will host two area blood drives:

► Tuesday, July 13: 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. at Pequot Lakes High School.

► Wednesday, July 14: noon to 6 p.m. at Immaculate Heart Catholic Church in Crosslake.

The American Red Cross continues to experience a severe blood shortage that is negatively affecting blood product availability across the country. Donors of all blood types - especially type O and those giving platelets - are urged to make an appointment to give now and help ensure hospital shelves are stocked with blood products.

While summer is traditionally a time when blood donations decline, this year is particularly challenging as many Americans receive their vaccinations and resume summer activities after more than a year of limited interactions and travel, leading to lower donor turnout.

Donors are needed now to prevent further delays to patient care. Schedule an appointment to give blood now.
