Author Douglas Wood to visit area communities

Award-winning author, illustrator and musician Douglas Wood will visit area communities on the following days:

Wood was the worst reader in his class, contending with ADHD and dyslexia before anyone knew what those were. But

he was lucky to have a special teacher who gave him the gift of books.

Now Wood is the creator of 34 books with more than 2.5 million copies in print, including classic children's books like "Old Turtle" and "A Quiet Place."

His popular and inspirational program motivates audiences to never give up, to overcome challenges and it teaches the vital importance of reading. Wood's musical presentation is ideal for kids and families.

Lakes Area Music Festival kicks off the 2021/22 Winter Series with a Judy Garland Tribute concert at 7:30 p.m. Saturday, Oct. 23, at the Gichi-zibii Center for the Arts at Brainerd High School, featuring Broadway soprano Andrea Ross.

There is no set admission fee to attend, but tickets must be reserved in advance through the organization's website.

From the vaudeville houses

of central Minnesota to the silver screen and Carnegie Hall, Judy Garland's legacy continues on. Enjoy the classics that Garland was known for, including "Embraceable You," "You Made Me Love You" and - of course - "Somewhere

Over the Rainbow."

Ross began her career in her hometown of Boston, where she was the youngest recipient of the prestigious Elliot Norton Award for Outstanding Actress. She caught the attention of legendary Broadway composer, Andrew Lloyd Webber, who became her mentor and took Ross under his wing. Webber and Universal Music Group: Classics and Jazz, produced Ross' solo album, Moon River, which debuted on the Top 50 UK Charts. Ross performed as Maria in the Broadway Tour of Rodgers and Hammerstein's "The Sound of Music" and has been a featured soloist with top symphony orchestras including

the Boston Symphony Orchestra, Baltimore Symphony Orchestra, Detroit Symphony Orchestra, Utah Symphony Orchestra, Royal Philharmonic Orchestra, BBC Symphony Orchestra, and KBS Symphony Orchestra in Seoul, South Korea.

For this performance, Ross will be joined by Lakes Area Music Festival Artistic Director Scott Lykins at the piano.
