**Why do I give? Let me share the reasons**

**N**ovember is upon us and within many churches there is talk of stewardship.

Wait, let me rephrase that. Talk of stewardship should be taking place. The truth is that most of my colleagues in ministry get a bit uncomfortable when it comes to talking about stewardship because that often involves talking about money and that is often interpreted as talking about your money, and that's when folks get either uncomfortable or defensive. Right?

And that is unfortunate for a number of reasons. It is unfortunate because it means that by not talking about money and faithful stewardship, many miss out on the joy of giving, the opportunity to share an expression of gratitude for all that God has done for us and promises to do for us.

With that thought in mind I would like to take this opportunity to focus on why I give.

**Reason #1: I give because of the Good News.**

My giving is part of my faithful response to what God has already done for me. My giving is an expression of gratitude for what God has done and what God desires to be done in the lives of others. My giving to my church, my college alma mater, to hunger ministries, social services, relief organizations and other

agencies is also part of this response.

I deeply believe that I cannot earn my salvation, but I can help share the love of Jesus and the grace of God through my faithful stewardship and thereby contribution to the sharing of the Good News with others.

**Reason #2: I give because there is a need.**

My giving is also usually initiated by being moved to act in response to a need in the world. When I see someone hurting or not being cared for, I wonder, "What can I do to help?" If I can contribute with a financial contribution, that is wonderful.

If my budget is constrained, I can still give through volunteering and helping in other ways.

**Reason #3: I give because I want to.**

There is no greater joy in life than the feeling of helping another person or bringing a smile to someone's face. When I was a kid, I ran across the word "philanthropist." When it was explained to me, I took it to mean being in a financial position to be generous toward others, to support things I believe in.

As I became older I tried a bit of philanthropy, and I found that it gave me joy. Being generous warms my heart when I can support a worthy cause.

**Reason #4: I give because it's part of God's work.**

I believe that the way I serve and give are part of God's work in the world, and we are all called to share in this work. Our vocations and God-given

gifts, strengths and passions aren't meant to be hoarded, but are to be used in service to our neighbor to build up the Kingdom of God.

**Reason #5: I give because my parents taught me by example**

I grew up in a family of givers. I listened when my dad preached his stewardship sermons. His faith-based attitudes about money were helpful in shaping my own attitudes about money, finances and stewardship.

My mother was an artist and I watched as she shared her God-given gifts and talents with others. As a kid I was given an allowance, and when I was a fifth-grader and delivering the Minneapolis morning paper each day before school, I knew and understood that a portion of such was to be given to God's work - through my offering at church or to nonprofits.

Over time, I learned and came to believe that this giving to God was the returning of some of what God has actually entrusted to my care. I credit my desire to give especially to my parents.

Hopefully we all have reasons for giving. Hopefully you too are experiencing the joy of giving. In light of Reason #5, I invite and/or challenge parents and grandparents to have this conversation with children and grandchildren. Talk to them about why you give and the joy you experience when you do so.

Oh, and to my clergy colleagues, you are welcome!
