## Faith in Action receives aging services grant

CASS COUNTY — Faith in Action for Cass County was awarded a grant from Older Americans Act to provide services to older adults living in central Minnesota during 2022.

This grant provides reimbursement for program services including transportation to and from doctor appointments, shopping and errands, chores and homemaker services, and accessibility modifications such as wheelchair ramps and railings.

Congress passed the Older Americans Act in 1965 in response to concern by policymakers

about a lack of community social services for older people. The original legislation established authority for grants to states for community planning and social services, research and development projects, and personnel training in the field of aging.

The law also established the Administration on Aging to administer the newly created grant programs and to serve as the federal focal point on matters concerning older people.

Although older individuals may receive services under many other federal programs, today

the OAA is considered to be the major vehicle for the organization and delivery of social and nutrition services to this group and their caregivers. It authorizes a wide array of service programs through a national network of 56 state agencies on aging, 629 area agencies on aging, nearly 20,000 service providers, 244 tribal organizations, and 2 Native Hawaiian organizations representing 400 tribes.

The OAA also includes community service employment for low-income older Americans; training, research and demonstration activities

in the field of aging; and vulnerable elder rights protection activities.

Current census data shows that Cass County's population of people aged 65-plus is at 27% and growing. Local services for seniors are the key to helping people "age in place" in their homes and communities.

In 2021, Faith in Action for Cass County served 346 people through their programs and 83% of those served were aged 60-plus. Faith in Action volunteers provided rides to appointments, chore services, building ramps and care giving support. In addition,

volunteers drove over 113,375 miles to furnish these essential services to members of our communities.

Faith in Action for Cass County is supported partly by state and federal grant funding, as well as by local individuals, businesses, civic and church contributions, and fundraisers.

## Pine River blood drive brings in 33 volunteers

PINE RIVER — The Pine River community hosted a blood drive with Vitalant on March 22 at Lifehouse Coffee that helped collect 43 units of blood products for patients in need.

A total of 33 individuals volunteered to donate blood and all were able to successfully donate. Five donors came forward to

donate power red cells (2RBC), which collects two units of red blood cells while returning platelets, plasma and a saline solution back to the donor.

Three people were first-time donors.

Donald Norman coordinated the drive and the Pine River Lions sponsored the blood drive.

The need for blood is constant and Vitalant strives to always keep a five-day supply of every blood type on the shelf to be able to meet the needs of patients across the region. Trauma and burn patients, premature infants, heart surgery patients, organ transplant recipients and people fighting cancer all require

blood transfusions for their care.

Blood donations are needed daily to maintain a strong blood supply and meet ongoing patient needs. Vitalant encourages healthy individuals to make blood donation a part of one's regular routine to help meet the ongoing needs.
