



Kolluri to run NJ Transit for remainder of Murphy’s time in office

Ex-Transportation Commissioner, Gateway CEO will replace Kevin Corbett

Former New Jersey Transportation Commissioner Kris Kolluri will serve as president and CEO of New Jersey Transit to succeed Kevin Corbett, the New Jersey Globe has confirmed.

Corbett announced today that he was stepping down after nearly seven years at the helm of the state’s long-suffering public transportation agency.

Kolluri, a former New Jersey Transit board chairman and hugely respected transportation expert, has agreed to run the agency until Gov. Phil Murphy’s administration turns off the lights in January 2026.

Most recently, Kolluri headed the Gateway Program Development Corporation, which completed the construction of a new tunnel under the Hudson River between New Jersey and New York in its first stage. He resigned in July after securing a \$6.9 billion grant from the Federal Transit Administration for the \$16 billion tunnel project.

Polly Trottenberg, the Deputy U.S. Secretary of Transportation and a former New York City transportation commissioner, is considered a possible candidate to run the Gateway program.
