COVID-19 UPDATE

Latest Restrictions due to COVID-19: The City of Coral Gables will be enforcing Miami-Dade County's Emergency Orders in response to the public health threat of COVID-19 as they apply to all of Miami-Dade County.

Effective 9 a.m. Thursday, March 19, 2020: All parks, beaches, and recreational facilities throughout the County are ordered closed. This includes both publicly-owned and private-owned parks, beaches, and recreational facilities. For the full Emergency Order, click here.

Also, Effective 9 p.m. Thursday, March 19, 2020: All non-essential commercial establishments are ordered closed. Essential establishments may remain open. For a detailed list, with requirements of those establishments that can remain open, please click here.

We want to remind you that Coral Gables is also enforcing the County's previous Emergency Orders including:

- Common-used moped, motorized scooter, bicycle or motorized bicycle, or any micro-mobility device are not allowed on any public street or sidewalk within the limits Miami-Dade County. Personally-owned devices are allowed. To view this Emergency Order, click here.

Take-out & Pickup Zones for Restaurants UPDATED

The City has converted all centralized valet locations in Downtown Coral Gables to Take-out & Pickup Zones. In addition, the City has added several more locations: Parking lot 25 adjacent to Giralda Plaza; 200 block of Andalusia Avenue near Chocolate Fashion; 2400 block of Ponce de Leon Boulevard near Cheesecake Factory; 300 block of Aragon Avenue in front of Caffe Abbracci; 300 block of Giralda Avenue in front of Tap 42; 200 block of Giralda Avenue near Terre del Sapore; and, 2600 block of Ponce de Leon Boulevard near Canton. There are now 45 spaces in the downtown dedicated to takeout and pickup parking. All of these locations will provide free parking for up to 10 minutes. Please look for the "10 Minute Take-out Parking Only" signs. Locations may be adjusted.

SBA Loans Now Available

Good news! The U.S. Small Business Administration announced that small businesses located in the State of Florida adversely impacted by COVID-19 can now apply for disaster loans. For small businesses, small agricultural cooperatives, small businesses engaged in aquaculture and most private nonprofit organizations, the SBA is offering Economic Injury Disaster Loans for working capital needs. Emergency Bridge Loan Program

Please don't forget that Florida has activated its Small Business Emergency Bridge Loan Program. The bridge loan program, managed by the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO), will provide short-term (one-year), interest-free loans for up to \$50,000 to qualified for-profit, privately held Florida small businesses (2-10
