Who is part of the Health Team for your Student?



Parent(s)

Parents play a big role in the ongoing communication and care of their student while at school.



Primary Care Provider

Parents work closely with their students Primary Care Provider to obtain orders and procedures necessary for their student to be successful while at school.



Clinic Nurse

The Clinic Nurse works with the Parents and Primary Care Providers to manage the students care and advocate for the student while at school.



Student

The Student is involved in various aspects of their health management as soon as they are developmentally able.

Are you ready for the next school year? Planning Ahead is Key

Paperwork that is due annually:

- Emergency Action Plans
- Annual Emergency Medical Authorization
- Updated Immunization Record
- OHSAA Sports Physical
- Daily Medication Orders

Emergency Medical Authorization

- This form is part of the <u>BACK to SCHOOL/Current Student Annual Forms</u> that are required to be completed each year by parents.
- This form is required for your student to participate in any field trips or off campus events.

Emergency Action Plans

These plans allow for staff awareness and steps to take in the event a medical emergency occurs while at school.

Allergy Action Plan

Students with life threatening food allergies should have an annual Allergy Action Plan at school.

- → What do parents need to supply:
 - The Emergency Action Plan completed and signed by the Parent and Medical Provider
 - Benadryl or Antihistamine according to orders
 - Epinephrine Pens (Epi-pen, Auvi Q etc.). Preferably 2.

* If student is permitted to self carry, the orders must indicate this and the medications/forms still need to be checked in by the Clinic Nurse.

Asthma Action Plan

Students with Asthma & may have a ongoing need for emergency medications should have an annual Asthma Action Plan at school.

- → What do parents need to supply:
 - The Emergency Action Plan completed and signed by the Parent and Medical Provider
 - New Asthma Inhaler original package/box labeled with students name/directions according to orders
 - Spacer if applicable

* If student is permitted to self carry, the orders must indicate this and the medications/forms still need to be checked in by the Clinic Nurse.

Seizure Action Plan

Students with Seizure Disorder that require emergency medications or treatment should have an annual Seizure Action Plan at school.

- → What do parents need to supply:
 - The Emergency Action Plan completed and signed by the Parent and Medical Provider
 - Seizure medication in original package/box labeled with students name/directions according to orders

Diabetes Management Plan

Students with Diabetes that require daily care & emergency medications/ treatment should have an annual Diabetes Management Plan at school.

- → What do parents need to supply:
 - The district Diabetes
 Management Plan and the
 Medical Providers
 completed and signed by the
 Parent and Medical Provider
 - All medications need to be in original package/box labeled with students name/directions according to orders

^{*}Student supplies/orders even if Self-Managing Care should be checked in with the Clinic Nurse and updated as applicable throughout the school year.

Prescription Medications

- Prescription Medications: A form must be completed for medications to be given at school.
 - The orders on the form should match the label on the prescription bottle.
 - ALL medications must be brought to the school by the Parent.
 - Prescription Medication Form
 - ➤ <u>Use of Medications Policy #5330</u>

Over-the-Counter Medications

- Over-the-Counter Medications: A form must be completed for medications to be given at school.
 - If the medication can be purchased by the parent without a script and you are requesting it to be administered according to the product label, this form can be used and only requires a parent signature.
 - ALL medications must be brought to the school by the Parent.
 - Over-the-Counter Form

OHSAA Physical Form

All students participating in Athletics are required to have an Annual Physical. The Athletic Department manages the due date of your student's physical.

Immunizations

- Updated Immunization Records should be submitted according to the Ohio Immunization Summary for School Attendance.
 - 7th Grade and 12th Grade have required vaccines and an updated record should be submitted prior to the start of the school year
 - 7th Grade Records can be sent to immunizations7@springboro.org
 - 12th Grade Records can be sent to immunizations12@springboro.org
 - All Immunization Exemptions Waivers are required to be submitted <u>annually</u>.
 - Immunization Exemption Letter

When are the forms due?

Ideally all Student Health Forms should be completed/signed after July 1st and brought to the clinic by the 1st day of school each year.

 Annual Student forms to include the *Emergency Medical Authorization* should be completed by September 1st.
