### What is the T-SAM?

The Targeted Violence & Terrorism Strengths, Needs, & Risks: Assessment & Management Tool (T-SAM) was developed by the Massachusetts Area Prevention Program at Boston Children's Hospital/Harvard Medical School to provide mental health professionals with a framework for identifying, assessing, and responding to risk for premeditated violence. Clinicians with training in the T-SAM report increased confidence working with youth and adult clients at risk of harming others.

T-SAM is the first tool of its kind, and provides a structured process for assessment, stabilization, and treatment tailored to the client's unique strengths, needs, and risks. It also provides a clear framework for how best to collaborate and consult with other providers from similar and different disciplines in order to manage risk.

#### T-SAM training helps mental health professionals:

- Understand when and how this tool can be helpful for the clients they see
- Center the client's perspectives while still valuing clinical judgment and collateral information
- Link assessment results directly to treatment planning and management
- Tailor interventions to the client's self-identified drivers of violence

### About this training

This 8-hour interactive training will provide an overview of the T-SAM framework and train mental health professionals to use the tool in their day-to-day practice. It also includes 8 one-hour case consultation calls, led by Dr. Cardeli, to discuss clinical application.
