



Update for July 2024

This month's immunization newsletter includes immunization updates from ACIP, back to school vaccination resources for providers, and more! ACIP updates include a recommendation for everyone 6 months and older to receive the updated 2024-2025 COVID vaccine and for all newborn infants to receive Nirsevimab shortly after birth if the mother did not receive the maternal RSV vaccine during pregnancy to protect them from severe RSV infection.

Immunization Updates

COVID-19:

CDC recommends everyone ages 6 months and older receive an updated 2024-2025 COVID-19 vaccine when these vaccines are available later this year.

- [In the 2023-2024 season, hospitalizations were highest in individuals >75 years of age, followed by infants <6 months of age. Although there are no vaccines available for newborns, maternal immunization can help protect young children.](#)
- 50% of pediatric patients who were hospitalized had no underlying conditions. In older kids, asthma was the most common underlying condition
- Only 5% of pediatric patients who were hospitalized had received 2023-2024 vaccine prior to admission
- [More children were hospitalized or died from COVID-19 than Influenza last year.](#)

RSV:

Infants:

- [Two reviewed studies showed that nirsevimab was 77% effective against RSV-associated ED visits and 91-98% effective against RSV-associated hospitalizations. We estimate that roughly 21% of infants in Los Angeles County were protected from RSV from either receiving nirsevimab or through maternal vaccination.](#)
- This season, we encourage all birthing hospitals and pediatric practices to administer nirsevimab shortly after birth during RSV season if they are eligible (eg no maternal vaccination)

Older Adults:

The updated recommendation for adults 60 and older is intended to simplify RSV vaccine decision-making for clinicians and the public. It is based on data about which groups of older adults are most likely to get a severe RSV illness, and the effectiveness of RSV vaccines introduced in 2023.

The best time to get vaccinated is in late summer or early fall, before RSV usually starts to spread in the community. However, eligible adults can get an RSV vaccine at any time.

- ACIP recommends adults 75 years of age and older receive a single dose of RSV vaccine.

- ACIP recommends adults 60–74 years of age who are at increased risk of severe RSV disease receive a single dose of RSV vaccine.
