11 Whereas, President Trump signed an Executive Order limiting immigration  
12 and entry for nationals of Iran, Iraq, Libya, Somalia, Sudan, Syria  
13 and Yemen and the President’s Executive Order outlines  
14 temporary procedural changes that will affect holders of current  
15 visas and immigrant visas (green cards) seeking entry into the US;  
16 and

18 Whereas, the impact of the President’s Executive Order and any additional  
19 proposals that could restrict or create barriers for vital international  
20 research and clinical collaboration efforts, our international  
21 patients and to bringing great talent to the US; and  
22  
23 Whereas, children whose loved ones are unable to re-enter the US, may  
24 endure stress about the uncertainty of seeing their family members  
25 for a prolonged period or permanently; and  
26  
27 Whereas, children with serious health care needs may not be able to come to  
28 the US, therefore be it  
29  
30 RESOLVED, that the Academy advocate for a timely reunification of children  
31 with their families impacted by the executive order limiting  
32 immigration and entry, and be it further  
33  
34 RESOLVED, that the Academy advocate for children with serious health care  
35 needs living in countries listed in the executive order limiting  
36 immigration and entry and be granted timely consideration, so as  
37 not to compromise their health and well-being.
