From the Desk of Rabbi Avraham Shapiro

Sefer Vayikra, that we are in the midst of reading weekly in Shul, is also referred to as Torah Kohanim (The Torah for the Priests). The simple explanation as to why our Sages use this name is because a large portion of the content of this book deals with the service in the Bais Hamikdash which is performed by the Kohanim. Many of the other parts of Sefer Vayikra also deal with the duties that the Kohanim are responsible for.

If so, why not just give Sefer Vayikra to Shevet Levi? I would like to suggest that one reason for this is to send us the message that the goal of a Torah way of life is that we should behave like Kohanim. Our mandate is to become a Holy Nation of Priests" and infuse the world with Kedusha.

This week we were fortunate to have Mr. Ronnie Adjmi, a successful international businessman, visit our community and speak to the students at Temima, YOY, and TDSA. He also addressed the adult members of our community at a special event Wednesday evening. His overall message was to be aware of the negative effects of digital technology and find a solution so that we will not become overwhelmed by high tech's influence and addictive nature.

One story he told during his presentation has made a deep impression on me.

Mr. Adjmi heard this from HaRav Matisyahu Solomon zt"l, Mashgiach of Gateshead and Lakewood Yeshivos. (I am paraphrasing);

A man asked the Chofetz Chaim why he was not a Kohen. He answered because your father was not a Kohen. The man inquired why wasn't my father a Kohen and the Rav replied because your grandfather was not a Kohen.

The Chofetz Chaim then turned to the man and asked him, "Do you know why your grandfather was not a Kohen?" The man replied "No."

So the Chofetz Chaim explained that long ago when Moshe Rabbeinu came down from Har Sinai and saw Am Yisrael worshiping the Golden Calf he cried out, "מי להשם אליו, follow me!"

Shevet Levi met that challenge and followed Moshe Rabbeinu and destroyed all those who were bowing down to this idol. Because Shevet Levi exhibited boundless devotion to HaShem in this world, they received the honor of serving as HaShem's Priests.

Says HaRav Matisyahu Solomon each generation faces a challenge where they are required to be מוסר נפש למן השם - to be willing to express complete and selfless devotion to HaShem in order to preserve Kedusha in the world. HaRav Solomon continues and teaches that in our generation our test is dealing with technology. He contends that smartphones and other handheld devices and games are the most addictive.

So our challenge is to come up with a solution. Mr. Adjmi suggested several things including using a FIG phone as a start.

Whether you choose to get a FIG phone or not, I think we all agree that the digital revolution has made raising children and living a life of Kedusha much more difficult. Ultimately each family will decide, for itself, how they will approach this matter.

Our collective mandate is to acknowledge the pitfalls of technology and to confront them seriously with מוסר נפש. The future of our children and our way of life are at stake. May Hashem grant us the wisdom and the strength to successfully meet these challenges.
