This one-day Fast Track workshop moves at a faster pace than the two-day Essential Elements workshop and is designed for learners who have some house calls experience but who are still relatively new to offering home-based primary care (HBPC) services for patients with complex medical conditions. Through this workshop, clinical providers, practice managers and operations staff will enhance their knowledge, competence, and performance in providing optimal HBPC based on current recommendations from national experts.
