WHAT

- Foundational education for clinicians and practice managers on critical topics in HBPC including Foundational Principles, Clinical Competencies, Economics of HBPC, Operations
 - Part 1: 2-day (12-hour) **Classroom Workshop** led by HCCI Center of Excellence (COE) faculty
 - Part 2: 1 hour/month group **Mentorship** for three months
 - Part 3: **Mini-Fellowship**, a 2-day field experience at HCCI Practice Excellence Partner (PEP) site
- **HCCI Centers of Excellence** are leading academic medical centers and health systems across the country partnering with HCCI to develop the HBPC workforce and increase the number of patients served through this unique model of care
- **Practice Excellence Partners** are house call practices that meet HCCI standards of care for clinical and operational effectiveness; participants accompany PEP personnel on visits or in the office

WHY

- HBPC is a proven model of care for chronically ill, medically complex patients, the so-called “frequent fliers” of the healthcare system and those who account for a disproportionate percentage of healthcare spending
- HBPC improves healthcare outcomes, improves patient and caregiver satisfaction and reduces overall spending
- Currently only 14% of patients who need HBPC receive it, partly due to a critical workforce shortage; to reach 50% of patients in need, an additional 1,000 providers are needed annually for the next five years

WHO

- Teams or individual clinicians, practice managers or social workers seeking to establish or grow an HBPC practice
- The next generation of HBPC providers – residents and students
- Attendees do not need to be affiliated with the COE to attend a workshop at the COE location

WORKSHOP DESCRIPTION:

The HCCI Essential Elements of Home-Based Primary Care™ classroom workshop is a two-day (twelve hours) highly interactive, discovery-driven learning experience. The goal of the workshop is to teach HCCI's approach to home-based primary care – based on the latest thinking and experience from national experts – from both a clinical and practice management perspective. The case-based sessions will focus on clinical and economic factors unique to home-based primary care to include patient assessment, medication management, infection control, coding and billing, staffing and reimbursement models.

WORKSHOP OBJECTIVES:

Upon completion of this educational activity, participants will be able to:

- Describe the role of HBPC in various contexts, including Population Health, Public Health, and the developing systems of healthcare.
- Apply the American Geriatric Society's (AGS) Guiding Principles in the approach to the care of people with multi-morbidities in the home setting.
- Provide optimal patient care in a simulated home setting, and demonstrate appropriate coding and documentation for the visit.
- Examine and discuss the business models, economic drivers, and quality indicators for HBPC and their impact on care delivery.
