A letter from Judy Orr:

Dear friends of Arlyn Phillips,

Now that the Miami Jewish Home has opened back up to visitors, I visited Arlyn Phillips today. All through Covid, I tried to contact her or get information about her. Only this week did I hear that she and Jackson (her husband) had been moved to another location on the campus where they can receive a higher level of care.

My visit with them was interesting. They were sitting at a small table in their apartment, and there was a caregiver with them. Arlyn and Jackson have both declined greatly in mental function

since I last saw them (pre-Covid). They obviously didn't know who I was when I arrived (I was wearing a mask), but after a short time Arlyn asked me two questions. "How is your dog, and how are the chickens?" (yes, I have chickens in my backyard). That was the extent of what she was able to communicate to me, but those two questions showed me that, without a doubt, she still knew me.

Jackson is able to hear and speak, but he doesn't remember much. For example, he doesn't remember that Arlyn is his wife. He told me that he knew her, but didn't know where he knew her from or for how long he had known her.

Arlyn is not able to hear well. She can understand what is being said to her, but you have to speak loudly. You can almost see the wheels turning in her brain to understand what you are saying, but when she tries to respond, she cannot put the words together to get her thoughts across.

The caregiver (Yolanda, whose English is about as bad as my Spanish) told that she is there for 3 hours in the mornings, and that another caregiver comes in for 3 hours in the afternoons. We really couldn't communicate with one another very well.

I was so happy to be able to see Arlyn again. My goal in sending this letter is to get as many people as possible back into her life. The caregiver told me that somebody from the church (St. Stephen's Episcopal, I guess) comes to see Arlyn each Wednesday. If you are able to go visit, you'll have to jump through some (minor) hoops. The day before your visit, you'll need to call 305-756-8583 and speak to Ernie (not sure of the spelling). Tell her when you are coming and she will give that info to the guard at the main gate so that you can get in. I think that it might be important that you visit when a caregiver is there. (I'm not sure that Arlyn or Jackson could get to the door on their own. They sat at the table the whole time I was there, so I don't know how



well they ambulate.) Oh, one very important detail – everybody there knows her as <u>Nevada</u> Phillips, and you have to use that name when you inquire about her. (Arlyn is her middle name).

If you are unable to go visit, perhaps you could send Arlyn a "thinking of you" card or note – maybe once a week. Keep it simple – talk about the weather (they have a great view of the outdoors from their bedroom), or memories you can share, or tell them what you have been up to.
