

RELEVANT LAWS FOR NONPUBLIC SCHOOLS FOR 2019-2010

(Note: There are no known changes in regulation that will affect nonpublic compliance as of July 30, 2019)

Applies directly as compliance issues

#	Bill Number / Statute	Description
1	HB 2627 / 105 ILCS 5/22-85*	<u>Parental notification of law enforcement detainment and questioning on school grounds</u> – Before detaining and questioning a student on school grounds who is under 18 years of age and who is suspected of committing a criminal act, a law enforcement officer, school resource officer, or other school security personnel must do first do some steps.
2	HB 1475	<u>Seizure Smart School Act</u> – Similar to Diabetes and Asthma statutes that allows for a seizure action plan, delegated care aides, staff training, administration of medicine, etc. *Not in effect until January 2020*
3	105 ILCS 5/22-33	<u>Medical cannabis</u> – Authorized students may be administered medicinal cannabis by a delegated person or parent.
4	105 ILCS 5/27-8.1	<u>Health examinations and immunizations</u> – Dental exams required in 9 th grade
5	105 ILCS 128/20(c)	<u>Number of drills; incidents covered; local authority participation</u> – Law Enforcement drill must be conducted within 90 days after the first day of school. Drill must be conducted with students present and all staff and students must participate (except that the administration can excuse students as needed)
6	410 ILCS 270/15	<u>Sun-protective measures in schools and youth camps</u> – A student may possess and use a topical sunscreen product while on school property or at a school-sponsored event or activity without a physician's note or prescription if the product is approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration for over-the-counter use for the purpose of limiting ultraviolet light-induced skin damage.

7	HB 0037*	<u>Seal of Biliteracy</u> – Allows nonpublic high school students to obtain the seal of biliteracy

#	Bill Number	Description
8	HB 2078*	<u>Minimum salary</u> – Minimum salary of \$40,000 for teachers.
9	HB 2719*	<u>Graduation requirements; Free Application for Federal Student Aid – FAFSA</u> required for graduation from public high school
10	SB 1798*	<u>Policy on sexual harassment</u> – Sexual harassment policy will be required for all student handbooks in public schools
11	HB 2265*	<u>Elementary school civics course of study</u> – One semester of civics education in 6 th , 7 th , or 8 th grade

Other anticipated changes to the probe

#	Description
12	Section II—Health topics: Training for CPR and AED in secondary schools
13	Section IV—Concussions: Monthly report required for students sustaining a concussion
14	Section IV—Safety Drills: Bus drills and safe bus riding instruction only required of schools “supported or maintained...by public funds”
15	Section IV—Student Medications: school may maintain undesignated supply of glucagon
