Neighborhoods - 429 Hours

Trained residents and heads of neighborhoods on leading the way to facilitate health, education employment, and crime prevention services to their neighbors.

Schools - 11,057 Hours

Mentored high school students in Power Lunch on what it means to be leaders, how to achieve academic success, and prepare for their futures.

Prisons - 90,000 Hours

Rehabilitated incarcerated and previously incarcerated men on servant leadership and how to return to society successfully. The high rate of DLF participants that do not return to prison is 91.3%. Which results in an approximate annual savings for Dallas taxpayers of \$3,280,000.

2018 OUTCOMES

- Served 11,747 in target neighborhoods
- Served 1,958 incarcerated and previously incarcerated individuals
- Served 2,097 youth and children
- Served over 500 families in need during the holidays - 46% of whom are living at or below the poverty line
- Utilized over 3,200 volunteers who donated 14,000 hours of service
