School Year Stats

School began on September 2, 2021 and ended on May 25, 2022.

Enrollment for K-6 was 75 students and preschool classes were an additional 23 students. This was a total of 98 which is an increased of 5 from the previous school year. It was an increase of 11 students in K-6. Preschool classes were down due to COVID.

The school staff revised and updated procedures which followed CDC, MDE, MDH, and DNU (Diocese of New Ulm as well as all dioceses in MN) guidelines and recommendations.

We were able to be in person all school. A few classes needed to quarantine in the fall and winter months due to potential exposures.

John Ireland Families fundraising obligation was \$700 per family. No fundraising obligation for Little Angels families.

Fifty-two JI Families raised almost \$45,000

Almost \$18,000 was given out in scholarships

Our Marathon/Annual Appeal goal was \$10,000 and we raised about \$18,000. We were able to celebrate Mass, and bike or walk outside. We also had our lunch.

We received a challenge matching grant opportunity this fall from the Schulze Family Foundation which resulted in \$61,075 for our school! These funds will be used for Teacher Recruit/Retain/Reward, Middle School Expansion, and Marketing/Development.

Our Little Angels Fundraiser, Breakfast with Santa, was held and raised about \$6,770 for our preschool program.

We received an anonymous donation of \$100,00 in November. This money has been added to our Catholic Community Foundation Fund and the interest will be used for scholarships.

Our kick-off for Catholic Schools Week was Mass, Breakfast, and Book Fair. The breakfast raised about \$1,375. We earned \$3,000 to spend on books and materials for the library through the book fair.

For our annual Luck of the Irish event we raised about \$54,000. In 2021 we raised \$50,500. We also sold a records number of raffle tickets, 646! In 2021 we sold 581 raffle tickets.

Our goal is to have a viable and sustainable school in which our families contribute $\frac{2}{3}$, and our parish support would then be $\frac{1}{3}$ of the expenses.

- ★ Enrollment was up for kindergarten through sixth grade
- ★ Christmas Program and Spring Program
- ★ Completion of FAST Assessments in Fall, Winter, and Spring to help guide instruction and meet the diverse needs of the students during this unique time
- ★ Given the approval to expand our school to include grades 7-8 in Fall 2022
- ★ Increased salaries to get closer to more just and fair wages - step and cost of living increases
- ★ Teacher Recruit/Retain/Reward program established because of Challenge Grant - In the spring a bonus was given to current teachers based on performance. A fall bonus is planned for returning teachers and a signing bonus for new teachers.

Our middle school will include grades 6-7-8. A budget was created this spring, enrollment was opened, and this summer steps are being taken to prepare for this expansion by hiring a teacher, ordering supplies and materials, and preparing the spaces needed.</p>
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Assessments - Overview

During the 2021-2022 school year we completed Fall, Winter, and Spring FAST (FastBridge Learning) Assessments in grades 1-6 for Math and Reading. Kindergarten completed early Math and early Reading FAST assessments.

- The main purpose of these assessments is to help guide instruction.
- Given the unusual spring, 2020-2021 school year and 2021-2022 school year, we acknowledge many students were struggling in a variety of ways which affected their results in both positive and negative ways. These assessments were just one means of identifying the direction of the instruction.
