Reflection The third Sunday of Advent is often referred to as Gaudete (Rejoice) Sunday. This Latin word from the introduction to this Sunday means to “Rejoice in the Lord; again, I say rejoice.” The reading from Isaiah is full of excitement and joy as our God is a saving God who is coming to bring unimaginable new life to his people.



Our lives are a journey made up of many small journeys.
