### SPECIAL PANEL DISCUSSION WITH GOGO, INC. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

#### RON LEMAY

Ron LeMay is chairman of the Board of Directors of Gogo, Inc. He serves as managing director for Open Air Equity Partners. Its portfolio companies include Gogo Inflight, Main Street Data, and Hyla mobile. LeMay has founded or cofounded eight companies in the last 10 years. Mr. LeMay was formerly president/COO of Sprint Corporation for almost 20 years and CEO of Sprint PCS. Mr. LeMay is a lawyer who practiced for 10 years in private practice and as corporate counsel.



#### MICHELE COLEMAN MAYES

A member of the Board of Directors of Gogo, Inc., Michele Coleman Mayes is vice president, general counsel, and secretary for the New York Public Library. Previously, she served as executive vice president and general counsel for Allstate Insurance Company, as a senior vice president and general counsel of Pitney Bowes Inc. (2003–07), and in several legal capacities at Colgate-Palmolive (1992–2003). She formerly chaired the American Bar Association's Commission on Women in the Profession.

#### EDWARD KNIGHT

Edward Knight is Executive Vice President and Global Chief Legal and Policy Officer of Nasdaq. Mr. Knight served as General Counsel of the U.S. Department of the Treasury 1994–99, where he was the Department's longest-serving General Counsel. He is a Trustee of the University of Texas Law School Foundation, a member of the Advisory Board of Columbia University's School of International and Public Affairs and a member of the Council on Foreign Relations and its Committee on Corporate Affairs. He sits on the Leadership Board of the U.S. Chamber of Commerce Center for Capital Markets Competitiveness, serves on the Board of Nasdaq Dubai and the United Arab Emirates' Securities and Commodities Authority Advisory Board, and served as a member of the Obama Transition Team at the U.S. Treasury Department in 2008–09.

#### SIMON M. LORNE

Simon Lorne serves as the vice chairman and chief legal officer at Millennium Management, LLC, overseeing its compliance, legal, regulatory, and internal audit functions. Previously, Mr. Lorne served as a partner at Munger, Tolles & Olson. In 1996, he became a managing director at Salomon Brothers, where he served as global head of Internal Audit. From 1993 to 1996, Mr. Lorne was the general counsel at the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission. He is an independent director of Teledyne Technologies Inc., and Chairman of the Alternative Investment Management Association.

#### RICHARD H. WALKER

Richard Walker is a member of King & Spalding, specializing in crisis management, cross-border government investigations and complex financial litigation. He retired from Deutsche Bank in 2016 after 14 years, where he served as Vice Chairman, General Counsel and a member of the Group Executive Committee. Prior, Mr. Walker was with the U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission, serving as Director of Enforcement (1998–2001), General Counsel (1996–98) and Regional Director of the Northeast Regional Office (1991–95). He is the only person in the agency's history to have served as both General Counsel and Director of Enforcement. Earlier, Mr. Walker spent 15 years in the New York office of Cadwalader, Wickersham & Taft, where he was a litigation partner specializing in corporate, securities, and commercial litigation.

#### STANLEY M. GROSSMAN

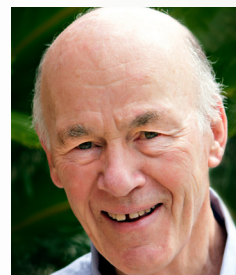
