ALL ARE WELCOME TO WORSHIP WITH US!

During worship, all are invited to come forward for Holy Communion. If you would like to receive Communion but cannot come to the altar, please let an usher know so the sacrament can be brought to you.

In addition to bread, you may now receive wine as well. You may intinct (dip your wafer into the chalice) or drink from the chalice directly. You may choose to receive the bread only. If you prefer, indicate by crossing your arms in front of you that you wish to receive a blessing instead. After church services, please join us for hospitality!

CHILDREN

Children are welcome in the church at any time. We encourage adult caregivers to join their children in the front chapel area as they engage seasonal lessons and materials.

RESTROOMS

Restrooms are available adjacent to the Gathering Area. All are welcome to use the restroom consistent with their gender identity. Diaper-changing facilities are available in both restrooms and in the nursery.

NEW SUMMER FORMATION OPPORTUNITY

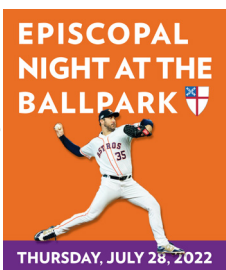


MAKING ONLINE CHURCH ACCESSIBLE

ST. STEPHEN'S FEATURED IN HOUSTON CHRONICLE ARTICLE ABOUT PRIDE

In a recent article entitled, "Pride is a year-round celebration for Houston-area churches," Lisa Hunt was quoted extensively about St. Stephen's support of Pride. Below is an excerpt:

Members at St. Stephen's Episcopal agree that Pride is not limited to June. The congregation is involved in advocacy, testifying during legislative sessions, as well as educational efforts. The church also recently launched a podcast called "Faith From the Margins," focusing on race and sexuality.

"Reaching out to the queer community has been part of St. Stephen's ministry for many years," Hunt said. "The Episcopal church has a history of realizing the gifts and talents of all its members."

Still, she sees a need for more justice.

"I've been a priest for 33 years, and I've always been amazed and so thankful for the faithfulness of the gay community," she said. "They are a witness of forgiveness and perseverance."

Too often, churches have hurt and pushed out members of the LGBTQ community, Hunt said.

"And yet they've never abandoned God and remain open to possibility," she said.
