


From Your Interim Rector

There is a minor debate every year about when the year begins. I guess there is a technical argument for January 1. But there is also the contention that it begins on the first Sunday of Advent each year (December 2 this year). That's when the new lectionary cycle begins. I think it really begins with the opening of school, or even after the Monday we call Labor Day.

We have an exciting year beginning anew at All Saints. Already underway is our regular service schedule: four Sunday services, three in the morning and one in the evening. There is a brand new Healing Service that is full of new energy and spirit, and we have new classes to inform and stretch us. Waiting in anticipation of the call of a new Rector does not mean we are waiting without purpose right now. I am so thrilled to be a part of it all!



When asked how long a search for a Rector should take, I respond with a stock answer, one honed over many search processes: "It should take about as long as it should but not much longer." While there is no cookie-cutter process, it routinely takes nine-to-twelve months in this diocese. You have a wonderful committee and a great Vestry. I look forward with you to the culmination of their work. Pray for them!

By the time you read this, Ministry Sunday will have been held. I hope you signed up for something or took information to help you decide how best to get plugged in to the life of the parish. Many helpful suggestions are being made about how we can reach out to everyone, ensuring none will be lost or underutilized. But you have to make an effort to become better informed and aggressive in volunteering. We need you! Help us make room for your talents and interests. It really is a stewardship issue. It is not simply about money (though money is clearly a part of stewardship). We need YOU!

The Rector's Forum will be one of two classes starting **Sunday, September 9**. Connie Standish will offer a "Spiritual Gifts" class that I think will be extremely helpful. And the clergy will offer a class on "Episcopal Worship 101." Our aim is to provide a refresher to old-timers and an introduction to those new to the church. There is a reading assignment suggested. We want to cover:

- What we do in Episcopal worship
- Why we do it
- What it means in our lives

Classes will be offered starting on **September 9** from 10:15 a.m. until 11:00 a.m. We will record the Rector's Forum and post it each week along with any Power Point presentations offered, in case you cannot make a session along the way. (Continues on page 3...)

If you need to leave during the service, you are able to exit through the side doors but will need to re-enter through the front doors.


We appreciate all of our parishioners working with us to keep everyone safe. The City of Winter Park Police Department will continue to provide officers when they are available for duty.


To give everyone a chance to reconnect or meet for the first time, the group's first meeting is a brunch. Childcare will be provided for anyone with young children.

The following week, **October 11**, the Thursday morning group will begin its study of Adam Hamilton's *Creed*. Come out to explore what Christians believe and why.


This group of ladies varies in age and is always warm and welcoming.

Rehearsals Are Underway for All Saints Children's Choirs



The children's choirs at All Saints Episcopal Church began rehearsals on **Tuesday, August 21**, from 5:00 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. **Please note this is a new time.**

Our approach will follow the Royal School of Church Music Voice for Life format. In addition to proper singing technique, choristers will acquire solid musical skills in sight singing, ear training, intervals, and rhythm. There will be two choirs:

- Coventry Choir for kindergarten through second grades (K-2)
- Canterbury Choir for third through eighth (3-8) grades

Coventry Choir

Jenn Rodrigues, our great All Saints School music teacher, will work with the kindergarten, first, and second grades. Miss Jenn has prepared these young charges admirably over the last four years. They have learned basic musical skills and exhibited fine singing skills and confidence at services.

Our children's choirs are a part of the All Saints Children's Ministry. Dolly Dunnam, as she has done for so many years, will continue to teach our children basic church behaviors, the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and songs that repeat weekly in our services (eg. Doxology, Sanctus, Welcome Song, and others). She is the one who organizes our robes, checks the kids in and out of rehearsals and services, and introduces our kids to the Kodály method, so essential for children to learn to sight read fluently.

Canterbury Choir

Claire Hodge will assist in teaching vocal and musical skills for the third-through-eighth grades. Mrs. Hodge has

national RSCM experience and directed the Orlando Deanery Girls Choir for sixteen years. She travelled with them to Germany, Austria, the Czech Republic, and England,

completing residencies at St. Paul's Cathedral in London and Christ Church Cathedral, Oxford on one of the trips. She directs a women's ensemble, Belle Voci, and Lutheran Cantata Choir. She is a private voice instructor for many Winter Park High School chorus students and All Saints choral scholars.

More activities involving the Glennon House are on the horizon. Watch for updates.



Annual Fall Festival Is October 25


