


To the People of All Saints: With Deepest Gratitude

All Saints is a parish I deeply love and at which I have spent a major portion of my ordained ministry. It remains difficult for me to imagine a life apart from this community. As Scripture tells us, “to everything there is a season, a time for beginnings and a time for endings.” Change comes to all with the passing of time. There is both grief and hopeful anticipation in my decision to transition out of full time ministry at the age of sixty-five.

I have given over 37 years of my life to ministry within the Episcopal Church. They have been extraordinary years—years of joy, challenge, and willing sacrifice. Increasingly, Nancy and I find our hearts drawn to be there for our adult children and grandchildren when they call on and need us. I want to continue to serve as an Episcopal priest in this diocese and beyond, but eventually in a way that will allow me greater time and flexibility. I have a deep love for Christian spirituality and the contemplative way, and I want to pursue study, teaching, and writing in these areas. My ministry career may be ending, but not my vocation.



All Saints is a large and complex community to oversee. I believe it is time for a new person to lead the parish into the future. One who will bring new insights and tested skills for building up this community in the love of Christ. I believe God will lead a very gifted person to join you and our incredibly dedicated staff for the next stage of All Saints’ life. Be assured that you have a great deal to do with who that person will be. It is the call of the search committee, the vestry, and the parish.

I’ve been reflecting on a quote by Henry Wadsworth Longfellow who said, “Great is the art of the beginning, but greater is the art of the ending.”

This comes with my profound gratitude for your love, friendship, and faithful support.

It has been a privilege to be your rector, priest, and friend. Nancy shares my heart for all of you. We will cherish every day that remains as we move to my last Sunday, February 11, 2018, the Last Sunday of the Season of Epiphany.

Farewell Celebrations

Sunday, February 4, at 5:30 p.m. will be Fr. Rob and Nancy's last celebration of the Celtic Contemplative Eucharist. A reception will immediately follow in the Mary Martha Parlor.

On Saturday February 10, at 6:00 p.m. join us for a Dinner Celebration and Program in the Thomas Center.

Sunday, February 11, is Fr. Rob's last Sunday as All Saints Rector. That morning, he will preside as Preacher and Celebrant at the 7:30 a.m., 9:00 a.m., and 11:15 a.m. Eucharist services.

Ash Wednesday on February 14 Marks the Beginning of Lent

The forty-day season of Lent, the fourth season of the church year, begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday, the day before Easter. This forty-day period reflects the forty days Jesus was tested in the wilderness after his baptism in the Jordan River.

During Lent, each of us is called to renew our commitment to Christ and to allow ourselves to dwell in that place that requires faith. We can celebrate a holy Lent by taking on a spiritual practice that strengthens our relationship with God, such as prayer, meditation, and the study of God's Holy Word.

We are also called to shed those indulgences, habits, and practices that turn our attention away from God. Lent provides us with a time to "clear out" a space for God through fasting, self-denial, and self-examination. In doing so, we recognize that it is God who has met and continues to meet our needs. These disciplines not only deepen our faith and bring us closer to Christ, they



encourage us to live out our faith by demonstrating our love for others as He has demonstrated His love and sacrifice for us.

We begin our Lenten walk on Ash Wednesday with the imposition of ashes and the words "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return," to remind us that we are mortal. Our liturgies during Lent are subdued, meditative, introspective, and penitential in nature. Often, they begin in silence and with the general confession of the congregation. The liturgical color during the Lenten season is purple, signifying the penitent and expectant mood of God's people. The responses and music follow a more contemplative stance, and joyful canticles, Alleluias and the Gloria in excelsis are omitted from worship.

Neither do we put flower arrangements at the altar during Lent. Though we are reminded of the pain of separation from God, Lent is not a sad or depressing time for those who are focused on what Christ has done for them!

Children's Ministry Makes First Grade Holy Communion and Lent Plans



Instruction for our first graders in the sacrament of Holy Communion begins Sunday, January 28.

The series of classes will convene at 10:15 a.m. in the Alleluia Chapel during Grace Place. Highlights will include a visit by Altar Guild member Greg Mellowe for a behind-the-scenes look at preparing the altar and a guided tour of the sanctuary and its stained-glass windows. The series will conclude with an instructed Eucharist in the Thomas Center for the children and their families.

All baptized Christians, regardless of age, are welcomed into the full body of Christ, and are invited to partake of the spiritual food of the body and blood of our Lord. Just as we do not withhold nourishment for the body until the child recognizes the nutritional value of such food, neither do we withhold spiritual nourishment until the child has some understanding of the grace received through the

Centering Prayer Begins Cynthia Bourgeault Study January 10



On Wednesday evenings from **January 10 to May 30**, the Centering Prayer Ministry will study Centering Prayer and Inner Awakening by Episcopal priest Cynthia Bourgeault, a well-known writer on the spiritual life. All are invited to participate.

In this guidebook, Rev. Bourgeault goes beyond an introduction to Centering Prayer and examines how the practice is related to the classic tradition of Christian contemplation, looks at the distinct nuances of its method, and explores its revolutionary potential to transform Christian life.

Topics covered in the book's chapters include the Centering Prayer method, the tradition, the psychology of the practice, and how it leads to inner awakening.

Each Wednesday, the ministry comes together as a community at 6:00 p.m. in the Church Chapel to experience God's peaceful presence in silent prayer. Wednesday Evening Women's Bible Study Begins *His Last Words* January 24



From January 24 to March 7, the Wednesday Evening Women's Bible Study will study *His Last Words* by Kim Erickson.

His Last Words is a seven-week Bible study that plumbs the depths of Jesus's final teachings to the disciples. It features:

- A verse-by-verse study of John 13–17 and portions of John 18–21
- Five lessons each week, one set aside for reflection and prayer
- Discussion questions for small groups
- Two weeks for review, reflection, and application and more

Jesus's last words are words of eternal life—powerful and full of love. If you've been longing for more intimacy in your relationship with God, more meaning in your life, and more boldness in your witness, *His Last Words* will draw you into just what you need: the Word of God.
