Sweet Briar College invites applications for a part-time, non-benefits eligible position of Adjunct Instructor/Assistant Professor of Studio Art for the Spring 2021 three-week term (April 1, 2021 through May 6, 2021). The ideal candidate will have a broad understanding of the field, including industry and art standards, and a working knowledge of a range of animation methods and styles with successful teaching experience. This position requires a thorough understanding of animation software and proficiency with a range of software tools including Adobe Creative Suite, the Wacom Cintiq drawing system, and Toon Boom Harmony software. Applicants should have experience working with beginning level students, and will also be expected to mentor animation students and to maintain a record of their creative production.

Candidates ready to work with a diverse student body are especially welcome. Sweet Briar prides itself on creating a learning environment that encourages young women to fulfill their highest potential. Leadership in all walks of life is fostered by the special connections our faculty make with their students, and Sweet Briar women translate their academic experiences into interesting and important lives.

Required Qualifications:

- M.F.A. or other terminal degree in animation or a related field, or extensive professional experience in computer animation/kinematics;
- Demonstrated successful teaching in animation;
- Active record of creative work which may include produced credits or festival screens; and
- Excellent communication skills.
