These framework deals recognize the important role that U.S. textile manufacturing plays as a counterbalance to global Chinese textile and apparel dominance and our industry couldn't be more grateful. These announced deals will help the multi-faceted U.S. textile industry and the cotton farmers it supports export more to Guatemala and El Salvador, a key market for U.S. textiles. This comes at a critical time for our industry and the 471,000 American workers directly employed by domestic textile manufacturers and its supply chain.

These actions will help preserve significant export markets for domestic textile producers in the Western Hemisphere and enhance the vitality of the U.S. industry. The U.S. -Western Hemisphere supply chains accounted for nearly \$34 billion in two-way textile trade in 2024 and stand as a bulwark to China and other Asian countries.

Thank you for your leadership and for your support of U.S. textile manufacturers. Please also convey our highest level of appreciation to President Trump.
