hands dirty and working outside. Greenhouse volunteers assist in the collection, propagation, and maintenance of native plants. Plants that are grown are used in restoration projects throughout the Refuge. Training is onsite, and volunteers meet every Thursday from 9 a.m. to noon.

Natural Guard volunteers assist with various projects that benefit Refuge visitors, wildlife, and plants. Removal of invasive plant species, trail-clearing, and bridge building are some of the many projects our Natural Guard volunteers have tackled. Training and tools are provided onsite. Natural Guard is scheduled on Thursdays and Saturdays from 9 a.m. to noon.
