In an effort to promote awareness of end-to-end Supply Chain job opportunities and careers, APICS Atlanta’s Skills Gap Task Force has launched a series of “Supply Chain 101” programming in elementary schools across Georgia. The objective is simple: help attack the Talent Gap in Supply Chain by creating more awareness of Supply Chain upstream, with 4th and 5th grade students. This initiative, driven by teams of volunteers from across the local Supply Chain space, has positively engaged almost 400 students over the course of 18 sessions since November 1st, 2017. Our practical, hands-on, hour-long program focuses on:

- ◇ **Student leader “report outs” on exercise**
