Cree Teachings with Harold Littletent and Family



Saskatchewan Culture, Recreation and Sport Districts have partnered to bring you 3 videos and related crafts and reflections during the Treaty 4 Gathering.

Harold Littletent, a cultural advisor of Plains Cree descent, and his family, the Dancing Horse Dance Troupe, from Kawacatoose First Nation, share information on a variety of dance traditions, regalia, drumming, and singing. These three 15-minute videos are intended for a classroom environment and are accompanied by age appropriate classroom activities, but can be enjoyed by anyone.

### Video Intros:

#### HAND AND POWWOW DRUMS AND TEACHINGS

Harold explains the protocols of drums and singing, and shares traditional teachings.

#### MEN'S AND WOMEN'S TRADITIONAL DANCING

Meet Tiny, who feels like a superhero when he dances in his traditional regalia, and will share the Sneak-up dance with us, and Raven, dancing for joy in her beaded regalia.

#### JINGLE DRESS AND GRASS DANCE

Meet Blueberry Girl dancing the musical Jingle dance, and Dennis, who shares the Grass dance in his colorful feathered regalia.
