Training Description

Dr. Yell will provide additional information and consultative support to administrators, special educators, graduate students and others. Components of a defensible ASD program, ensuring goals and objectives are measurable and the importance of documenting student progress will be reviewed.

On March 22, 2017, the U.S. Supreme Court handed down a decision in the case Endrew F. v. Douglas County School District. In Endrew, the Supreme Court heard arguments that there is not a clear standard for the level of benefit schools must provide to students in special education. Is some small degree of benefit enough? Or do students have a right to something more meaningful? In the unanimous opinion, the Supreme Court ruled that in developing IEPs, school districts must aim to enable a student to make academic and functional progress in light of his or her circumstances. According to the Supreme Court the new standard “is markedly more demanding than the “merely more than de minimis” test” currently applied by many U.S. Circuit Courts of Appeals in special education cases. The presenter, who attended the oral arguments in the Endrew case, will discuss this extremely important case, how the decision will profoundly affect special education, and implications for the future of special education for students with disabilities.
