# **83<sup>rd</sup> AACA Annual Meeting Seminar Descriptions *(Subject to Change – last updated 1-21-19)***

## **Friday, February 8, 2019**

**Lenny's Garage in Brooklyn:** As the owner of 65 cars and trucks dating back to 1912, I am often asked to talk about my collection (especially since it is located in an inner city). I have many anecdotes about the hobby and have become a bit of an automotive historian and "backyard mechanic" and for 21 years have written a column called "Brake Lines." To begin, I will show a 4-minute video about the Gowanus neighborhood of Brooklyn and my big garage housing 50 American cars and trucks (plus motorcycles, motor scooters and bicycles).

**Decorating Your Garage:** Now that you have your one car or many, how do you enhance your garage with period advertising or parts. I will explain how and why it matters what you display in your garage. I will have photos of different collections and how they are displayed. I will discuss the value of buying period advertising as opposed to buying new or reproduced advertising. Also, how to know the difference in original and reproduced advertising.

**Automotive Advertisements & Building the Lego Bookmobile:** We will introduce you to the AACA Library's newest research tool - our Automotive Advertisements website - and take a look at various ads through the years. We will also discuss how we designed a custom Lego kit depicting the Library's '55 Chevy Bookmobile and share the history of Lego and cars.

**Hide & Seek: Finding What You Want on the Internet:** Workshop on search tips and techniques for finding antique vehicles and parts on eBay and elsewhere on the Internet. The first part is a discussion of ways to expand normal searches, followed by an activity where the participants come up with needs and assist others with actual online searches.

**Hosting a National Meet in Minimal Time:** Review guidelines, outside funding/sponsorships, recruiting volunteers, securing venue, finding parking, hour by hour logistics and other tips for a successful meet. Lessons learned from my experience last year!

**British Automobiles in the U.S. 1945-1984:** America's postwar attraction to the small, well-handling British sports cars and the need for British companies to export goods to survive economically caused the importation of many British autos into the U.S. We will discuss this, how they were used and their influence on design of some American cars.

**Automobile Objects of Art:** Items depicting cars of 1900-1920 - China, glass, art, paper, catalogues, stock certificates, early photographs.

**Market Value Trends:** A recap of Arizona auctions with a fun interactive exchange between speaker and audience. Includes a review of sales of popular models and vehicles of particular interest.

**History of the Ford Mustang: Celebrating 55 Years:** A peek into the early days of Ford, its manufacturing and the events leading up to the development of America's first pony car, the Mustang. Then an archival dive into each generation of the Mustang, significant models, its effect on racing and the celebration of 55 years of Mustang.

**eBay to Grand National in 470 Days:** The 470-day journey from initial purchase of a 1949 MG TC on eBay sight unseen to it receiving an AACA Grand National award, with all work being done by the owner.

**National, Regions and Chapters AACA Insurance Program: For Officers, Meet Chairpersons & Those Responsible for Any Club Activities:** We will be discussing the liability risk exposures that may be experienced by Regions and Chapters during meetings, shows, parades and tours. We will also discuss Directors & Officers coverage, certificates of insurance and social media exposures.

**How to Restore and Store Batteries:** We will discuss methods used to rejuvenate batteries, things we can do to extend battery life and how to store batteries when not being used.

**First Generation Camaros: '67, '68, & '69:** By the time this seminar is over, you will have a greater knowledge and appreciation for the first generation Camaros. You will learn about easy model year identification, engines available in those model years, popular packages available (RS, SS, Z28), interior and exterior features, and unusual or rare options. Throughout we will also give a brief history of model design and development. (Darrell Page)

**The World of Wild, Weird & Wacky (But Wonderful) Cars:** The library guys will take a look at some of the most interesting vehicles to ever hit the street. From concept cars and one-offs to alternative power cars and vehicles that never quite made it into production, this seminar is sure to be informative, creative and FUN!

**Automobilia: The History and Thrill of Collecting:** A look at the history of collecting automobilia - what it is and what it represents. What do you collect that is related to the history of the automobile?

**Preparing for Touring:** Repairs, restoration, and maintenance.

**Keeping Tabs on Hobby-Related Legislation:** What you should know about how legislation affects you and the hobby and what you can do about it.

**National Activities Seminar: Effective Negotiation for Meets and Tours:** Intro by Marty Roth, VP National Activities. Don Barlup & Chuck Crane will present what meet and tour planners need to know to work with hotels, restaurants and tourism groups.

**History of the Flathead Ford V-8 Engine:** We will discuss how the 1932 Ford V-8 engine was developed and how it evolved through the years. Includes pre-1932 and post-1953 events.

**Post Cards: Prosaic Pictures From the Past:** Post cards containing pictures of your favorite cars as they existed in their natural habitat are of interest to collect. The history of post cards is briefly covered. My collection of 600+ post cards showing the 1955 Dodge are used as an example.

**Vintage Chevrolet Club:** We will share samples of newly digitized vintage Chevrolet promo films, which are instructive and fun to watch! Attendees will be updated on Club activities and benefits, including free bidder passes to all Mecum Auctions, our monthly award-winning magazine, judged meets, tours, technical advice and upcoming July 2021 "Anniversary Meet" in Bowling Green, KY. New members will receive a free copy of the popular "100 years of Chevrolet" published by Automobile Quarterly in 2011.

**The ABCs of Spray Chrome:** Take a journey with us and learn the ABCs of spray chrome. Gain an understanding of the advantages and disadvantages by taking a detailed in-depth look at the equipment, process, durability, cost, chemicals and their impact on health and the environment. Don't miss out on this opportunity to expand your knowledge from a courier professional whose life-long passion of inventing specialized coating has gained his brand popularity around the world.

**Automotive Upholstery 101:** A brief synopsis of the ins and outs of tackling automotive upholstery, tricks of the trade, do's and don'ts, experiences, kits vs. custom, and why it's not always a DIY project.

**Motor Girls or More Than Just Alice Ramsey:** A light hearted look at women drivers in the early days of the automobile - from Mercedes Benz to the ambulance drivers of WWI - the women, the fashions for driving, the "manners," their stories. Also, some novels about women drivers in those times.

**Support for Region & Chapter Officers Seminar:** Panel discussion including: Chester Robertson, Kelly Adams, Mark McAlpine and Fred Trusty.

**Drivers Participation Class (DPC):** Let's discuss what DPC does for AACA and its members.

**Publications Seminar: Producing a Successful Newsletter:** Fran Shore will talk about her editing experiences over the years and Dave will follow with a presentation titled "How to Lose Points on Your Newsletter Judging," plus lots of Q&A time.

**Reel Cars:** Always a favorite -- this seminar has been presented for 19 years at the Annual Meeting. Michael will be showing several new films this year, including a great "White Truck" film, a 1935 Plymouth film with a start you have to see, some great new TV spots and some other surprises.

**The PA Turnpike: A History:** A pictorial and video history of "America's First Superhighway," from the creation of the commission in 1935, to construction in 1938 and 1939, through completion in 1940 and early operations. Discussion includes the ideas and events that spurred the formation of the superhighway, including the Great Depression, an abandoned railroad, and the looming threat of WWII.

**Restoration Experiences and Tips: Engine Rebuilding Tips, Do's and Don'ts:** This seminar will emphasize engine rebuilding. Tips on when to rebuild, how to rebuild, partial rebuilds and when it is unnecessary. Audience participation is encouraged and the seminar is open to all topics, if time allows.

**More Than Just a Lady Driving a Car:** The racing career and life of Joan Newton Cuneo, pioneer lady race car driver.

**CJE Instructor's Seminar:** For current CJE instructors and those wishing to become CJE instructors.

**Planning Your Collector Car Estate:** An enthusiast's guide to planning your collector car estate.

**Webmasters' Forum:** This will be an open discussion forum about region/chapter websites. We will also discuss the scoring sheet used when evaluating the websites.

## **Saturday, February 9, 2019**

**Collector Car Fraud/Estate Planning Collector Cars:** Reviews the "hidden traps" for unwary collector car purchasers and a brief review of the steps every collector should put in place to take care of their collection upon the "passing on" of the collector.

**National Judging School:** Open to all AACA members. Target audience is National Judges receiving annual required training. First time AACA members thinking about becoming judges are extremely welcomed, as are vehicle owners wishing to know more about how their cars are judged.

**Touring Safely With Your Car:** A discussion about safety and things to do before a drive or tour with your car.

**Managing Classic Vehicle Collections:** Managing even simple tasks such as routine maintenance, repairs and upgrades becomes a daunting challenge once you have more than a few cars in your collection, and most are trying to manage these tasks and to-do lists with whiteboards, post-it notes or spreadsheets. This presentation will discuss effective methods for organizing and managing the tasks associated with your collection.

**The Tin Goose Travels to Pebble Beach Concours:** Penn College students present the process of working on the Tucker Tin Goose in preparing for the world-renowned Pebble Beach Concours D'Elegance. It is considered the experience of a lifetime.

**Historic Preservation of Original Features (HPOF):** This is an overview of the HPOF class.

**Female Automotive Innovators:** A look back through automotive history to highlight the many female innovators who helped lead the way.

**55 Years of Das Awkscht Fescht:** The history of the August festival in Macungie, PA, including predecessor events. This slide show outlines the five phases of Das Awkscht Fescht and illustrates the themes and motor vehicles on display.

**Race Car Certification:** This seminar will review AACA race car judging and certification, including any recent changes to the process.

**The Virtual Car Lot: Buying and Selling Vehicles Online:** A look at the processes for buying and selling antique vehicles on eBay, Craig's List and Facebook Marketplace, with examples of actual sales/purchases. Followed by activity locating wanted vehicles and valuing vehicles online.

**Restoration Q&A:** Bring YOUR questions and restoration problems to the panel of experts with nearly 100 years of combined experience. The entire seminar is devoted to audience questions.

**The Lady and the Automobile in Art:** Since the beginning of the automobile, a pretty lady has been a part of motoring history in art and advertising. This is a look at art objects showing the lady and the automobile and how artwork helped influence early motoring.

**How Not to Get Burned Buying Vintage Advertising:** We will be discussing what to look for when buying antique advertising, and how to tell if a sign is vintage, reproduction, fantasy or has been restored.

**History of Charles W. Nash & Nash Motors:** This is the greatest rags-to-riches story in American automobile history! The life and times of this one of only 4 "Titan's" in Automobile industry in our country. Company history up to last Nash car in 1957 & onto American Motors formed in 1954 with information about it.

**Modern Motor Oils:** Discussion of the latest passenger car motor oils and how they help your vehicle's service life and performance.
