SEMINAR DESCRIPTIONS – FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 10

Dawn of the Automobile Age 1769-1910: The development of man's greatest means of transportation actually looks back as far as 1335 with wind-driven vehicle attempts, but concentrates on developments after Nicolas-Joseph Cugnot with steam in 1769.

The Law & Collector Cars: What you should know about buying and selling collector cars (titles, matching numbers, etc.). This seminar is a source of good sound advice by Mr. Monopoli and Mr. Shook who are experienced in these areas as they pertain to AACA members.

Market Value Trends: A recap of the Arizona auctions with a fun exchange between speaker and audience to test their market value knowledge of popular models.

Advancing Your Hobby: Auto Tech Training for Seniors: When I retired at age 63, I started the 2-year automotive technology training curriculum at my local community college. This PowerPoint presentation will feature the steps that I took to enroll, the course itself (which exceeded all expectations), and how it has helped me to enjoy this hobby. The classes have also helped me to work on my own classic car, a 1966 Pontiac GTO. I finished my last course on automotive air conditioning in the middle of May 2016. I already miss the classes, the instructors and my fellow students.

History of Auto Emission Controls: Chronological description of how present emission controls evolved from identification of harmful emissions, early and later mechanical methods of emission reduction to present day electronic emission management.

Repair & Maintenance of Convertible Tops: Learn how to keep that convertible top working -- moving up and down, alignment with the side windows, etc.

Automobile Objects of Art: Pre-1920s automobile art and objects; antique toys included.

Estate Planning -- Your Cars, Your Estate: This presentation will focus on estate planning, which will help AACA members and their families prepare their car, car collection or automobilia for the inevitable. This seminar addresses a simple plan that will help your heirs and avoid the pitfalls associated with estates. The seminar will provide good sound advice on the dos & don'ts of estate planning.

Chrome Plating & Metal Re-Finishing: This seminar will include information and discussions on pot metal restoration, processes, SS straightening & polishing, and metal repairs.

Shelbys: Early Shelby American history as it relates to the GT350 and race cars effort.

Buying and Selling on eBay & Craig's List: Comparing the use of eBay and Craig's List for hobby-related buying and selling.

Steering Wheel Recasting for Restoring the Look & Feel of the OEM: The focus of the seminar will be to familiarize attendees with the process of recasting classic car steering wheels, while emphasizing the originality and feel of the OEM wheel. Mopar: A discussion on a variety of mopar related topics presented by several experts.

Brass is Beautiful: A look at brass era vehicles and the joys of motoring at the dawn of the automobile age.

Odd Options: The Strangest Factory & Aftermarket Accessories of All Time: With the decline in option sheets today, it's easy to forget the kind of choices we had in the past. More than just picking your engine and transmission, classic option sheets gave you the opportunity to add some pretty strange details to your car--and aftermarket options were endless. In this presentation, we examine some of the strangest factory and aftermarket accessories available.

SEMINAR DESCRIPTIONS – SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 11

1949-1951 Mercury Technical Book: I am the lead author for the book for the Early Ford V-8 Club of America. The book is a compilation of how these cars were manufactured by Ford Motor Co. I have researched the Ford archives in Dearborn, Michigan, at the Benson Ford Research Center. Many original pictures and documents are included in the book, as well as advertising brochures, Ford factory manuals, Ford templates and parts directions/instructions. The book was completed in February 2016.

Humorous History of the Automobile: A somewhat humorous and thoughtful look at the automobile, its impact and our hobby. This is a 160 page viewing and commentary (PowerPoint presentation) of the automobile and its impact on almost every aspect of society. Seven organizations have asked for and received this "lecture," which has been suprisingly well-received. (45-50 minutes)

Collector Car Fraud: Overview of various frauds invading the collector car market -- private sales, internet sales & auction sales -- what to watch out for in counterfeit documents, titles, restamped engines, converted cars & fake numbers matching.

Collections of Collections: Collections of collections and how they tie to the automobile -- plates, china, buttons, etc. Kevin will be sharing items from his extensive collection.

The Ultimate Restoration!: W.F. Harrah's personal collection would grow to over 1,400 classic automobiles. In 1963 he discovered one iconic vehicle which would become the most famous car restoration of all time, and the most challenging. It was the 1907 Model 35 Thomas Flyer, driven by George Schuster winner of the epic 1908 New York to Paris Race. Hear the "actual voices" from the past of Bill Harrah and George as they describe the project! We will also visit the future of Automotive Restoration with 3D and 4D printing. Join us for this incredible journey and see why the Flyer is now part of the National Historic Vehicle Register.

Restoration Experiences and Tips II: Paint & Body Work, Small Parts Fabrication, Upholstery: This seminar emphasizes body work, small parts fabrication, upholstery and wood working restoration topics. An audience-driven seminar where the audience selects from dozens of topics in power point format from over 20 years of restoration experience or their own restoration experiences/problems. Audience participation is encouraged.

Certifying & Judging AACA Vintage Race Cars: Discussion on how to get a vintage race car approved for AACA events, and also how to judge a competition vehicle.

History of Charles W. Nash & Nash Motors: Come enjoy an inspirational and motivational slide show PowerPoint presenation of the life & times of my maternal great grandfather and the "Greatest Rags-to-Riches Story in American Automobile History."

FOR THE LADIES: The Truth About Collecting. Is it trash...or treasure?: Entertaining and educational storyteller and Master LifeStyle Transition Strategist, Sheree Richnow, has for the past 12 years processed over 800 homes and helped re-direct hundreds of thousands of dollars worth of collectibles. Attendees will learn about the reality of collecting things and what's more likely to become trash...or treasure.

History of Automotive Trophies: Learn the history of automotive trophies through Kevin's collection of trophies starting with his 1901 Silver First Mile Minute Recorded Steam Car to present day tied into the AACA Awards.
