Coronavirus Economic Relief for Transportation Services Act (CERTS Act)

Introduced

Sen. Susan Collins (R-ME)

Sen. Jack Reed (D-RI)

CERTS Act

Over-the-road bus including-

- Local and intercity fixed-route service
- Commuter services
- Charter or tour services (including tour or excursions service that includes features in addition to bus transportation, such as meals, lodging, admission to points of interest or special attractions, or the services of a guide).
- School bus service

CERTS Act

The Secretary of Treasury, in consultation with the Secretary of Transportation, shall use \$10 Billion

to:

- Provide grants, and
- Other forms of emergency assistance to eligible providers.

CERTS Act

Conditions:

- **Maintain employment through December 31, 2020** (pay, paid administrative leave, and paid benefits as of the date of enactment.)
- **Recall or rehire** any employee paid off, furloughed, or terminated because of reduced service.

CERTS Act

In determining the amount of assistance to provide an eligible provider, the Secretary shall take into consideration:

- the estimated revenue and cash flow of the provider of transportation services during the 12-month period beginning on the date of receipt of the assistance.
- the debt owed on major equipment; and,
- other sources of Federal assistance.

Cannot exceed the total amount of revenue earned by the provider during the **calendar year 2019**.

Reduced by amount received through Paycheck Protection Program (PPP).

GRANTS: not less than 50% of the amount will be used to provide grants.

CERTS Act

Eligible activities-

- Acquisition of services,
- equipment,
- personal protective equipment,
- other measures needed to protect workers and customers from COVID-19.

CERTS Act

Continued operations and maintenance of existing capital equipment and facilities including:

- rent,
- leases,
- insurance, and
- debt services.
