At Trinity Church, we believe God's love is expansive and unconditional and that through Christ, God has called us to love one another as God loves us. - Sign in, so we know you are here. Clipboards are at both Elm and Main doors.
- This service is being live-streamed. If you do not wish to appear on camera, please sit in the back 4 pews of the nave.

By attending in person today you are assuming the risk that there may be people here who are unvaccinated, have tested positive for Covid-19, have recently traveled to higher risk places in the US or around the world. We are no longer asking for attendees to attest to these matters, so you are releasing Trinity from any liability.

Moses said: Now this is the commandment--the statutes and the ordinances--that the Lord your God charged me to teach you to observe in the land that you are about to cross into and occupy, so that you and your children and your children's children, may



Gospel Mark 12:28-34

Gospeler The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, according to Mark.

People Glory to you, Lord Christ.

One of the scribes came near and heard the Sadducees disputing with one another, and seeing that Jesus answered them well, he asked him, "Which commandment is the first of all?" Jesus answered, "The first is, 'Hear, O Israel: the Lord our God, the Lord is one; you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength.' The second is this, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these." Then the scribe said to him, "You are right, Teacher; you have truly said that 'he is one, and besides him there is no other'; and 'to love him with all the heart, and with all the understanding, and with all the strength,' and 'to love one's neighbor as oneself,'
—this is much more important than all whole burnt offerings and sacrifices." When Jesus saw that he answered wisely, he said to him, "You are not far from the kingdom of God." After that no one dared to ask him any question.


