The California Foundation for Agriculture in the Classroom will host two Seed Survivor truck and trailer units that serve as a plant nutrient field trip on wheels in California between November 5 and March 31, 2019. The unit is curriculum-based with interactive learning experiences that teach California elementary students about growing healthy plants and where their food comes from.

The foundation is in real need of Seed Survivor Presenters in the area. Please note, this is a paid position, \$20/hr and mileage. There is a standard script to follow so no previous experience is necessary. Normal work hours are Monday through Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. with a lunch break in between.

The Seed Survivor Mobiles will be in Central California between January 7 and February 15, 2019. Below is a schedule of when we are in each county.
