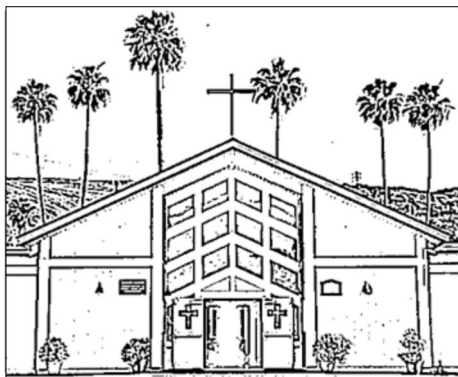

THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD

Today we would normally celebrate the 7th Sunday of Easter. However, this year we celebrate the Feast of the Ascension. Reginald H. Fuller in his Preaching the Lectionary: The Word of God for the Church

Today adds this comment on this feast day – ‘First, let us remind ourselves that Ascension Day should not be thought of as a historical commemoration. The New Testament treats the ascension as an integral part of the Easter event. In fact, the earlier Easter narratives depict the appearances as manifestations of the already risen and ascended One. Hence Paul could include his Damascus experience among the appearances in 1 Corinthians 15. . . With the revised Church calendar, we still keep it on the fortieth day as a matter of convenience (and that this is not an absolute rule is indicated by the rubrical permission to transfer the observance to the following Sunday). This allows us to isolate for contemplation one aspect of the total Easter event’. Today’s first reading is from the beginning of Luke’s Acts of the Apostles, which was written sometime between 80 and 90 AD. Luke addresses this book to Theophilus, which is Greek for “one who loves God”. It is most likely that it was addressed to all those of good will. The Acts of the Apostles recounts the history of the early Church. In this first reading, it recounts the story of the Ascension. Luke mentions that Jesus appeared to His apostles for 40 days after the resurrection. Forty was a sacred number in the bible. Remember that in Exodus, the Hebrews wandered in the desert for 40 years and that Jesus fasted for 40 days and 40 nights. We don’t know how long Jesus’ post-resurrection appearances lasted. We do know that the Ascension was the last time Jesus appeared to His apostles. Again the apostles ask Jesus when the kingdom of Israel will be restored. They still do not understand that the Kingdom of God is not a worldly kingdom. He simply tells them that only the Father knows when or if that will happen. Note also that Jesus specifically tells His disciples not to leave Jerusalem until they have received the Holy Spirit. That event is recounted in next Sunday’s readings, the Feast of Pentecost. The Gospel reading is from Matthew, the brief final verses of his Gospel. Note that this is not the story of the Ascension. Matthew does not recount that event. It is the “Great Commissioning” of the apostles by Jesus to “go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations”. It is also the first time that the liturgical phrase “in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit” is used. As with all major events in Matthew, this takes place on a mountain. Jesus is the fulfillment of the Hebrew Scriptures. The final verse is the great promise made not only to the apostles but to all people – “And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age”. The Ascension is not the end but the beginning as we see in the Acts of the Apostles. Easter season is rapidly drawing to a close and will end next Sunday with the celebration of Pentecost, the coming of the Holy Spirit.

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION
THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD

There was a curious custom years ago that perhaps developed in an age when Easter was seen less as a baptismal season than as a kind of tour through the deeds of the Risen Christ. The paschal candle, sign of Christ's presence, was removed from public view on Ascension Thursday, banished to the baptistery.

Ascension day does speak of the hidden aspects of Christ's life among us, but it does not have much to do with God's absence. Christ has not shed his human life like an inconvenient shell, but rather has taken humanity into heaven. The theologian Karl Rahner said that it is a festival of "the nearness of God." In vanishing from our sight, Christ has become utterly available to all at every time and every place, and is "closer to us than he ever was."

Today is the feast of believing that beyond our final breath is a presence that waits for us, a banquet prepared, a tender homecoming embrace. Rahner said that today is a festival of the future of the world, a day for anticipating the world's true destiny, and therefore hardly a day to be going around hiding candles!

SAN FELIPE NERI (1515-1595)

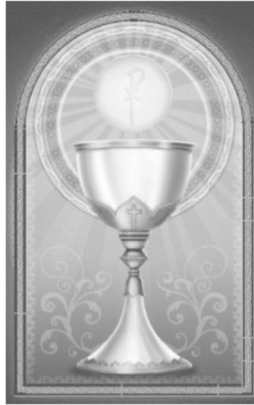
San Felipe tenía dos libros favoritos: el Nuevo Testamento y uno de chistes, sin duda que es el santo del buen humor. Su padre quiso que fuera comerciante, pero una visita a las catacumbas de los mártires transformó su vida. Estando en la universidad decidió educar a los jóvenes y vender todos sus libros para dar el dinero a los pobres, pues "sólo amar" es lo que cuenta. Se entregó en cuerpo y alma al apostolado juvenil atrayendo jóvenes ricos y pobres al cuidado de los enfermos, servicio en hospitales y vida de oración. Su intimidad con Dios fue tan notable en su sabio consejo que éste fue buscado por obispos y papas; de hecho, fue director espiritual de grandes santos como Ignacio de Loyola y Carlos Borromeo. Fue ordenado sacerdote en 1551 y fundó un oratorio designado a la instrucción espiritual, al canto y a la caridad. Debido a su santidad y calidad de vida, uno de los papas quiso nombrarle cardenal y le dejó un sombrero cardenalicio en su cuarto, pero san Felipe lo utilizó para atrapar la pelota.

AQUÍ ESTÁ EL PLAN DEL JUEGO

Cuando escuchamos un pequeño texto de un Evangelio en particular, es fácil tener los detalles y las historias de todos los evangelios mezclados y combinados en uno solo. El teólogo Gerhard Lohfink dice que esto es “¡Haciendo una sopa del Evangelio!” Para entender el pasaje del Evangelio de hoy, debemos darnos cuenta de que esta historia solo se encuentra en el Evangelio de Mateo y su historia sucede justo después de la Resurrección. No hay un Tomás incrédulo o alguna de las otras historias que hayamos escuchado desde la Pascua.

¿Qué tan frecuente haces un plan en un evento diciendo: “si nos separamos, regresa al auto y espera” o “quédate en la fuente del centro comercial, ahí te encuentro”? Antes en Mateo, Jesús dijo a las mujeres en el sepulcro decir a los discípulos: “que se dirijan a Galilea, y que allá me verán” (28:10). Este era el plan del juego tanto como una referencia geográfica como espiritual. “Vuelve a lo que sabes, a lo que recuerdes”. Ellos estaban confundidos y lastimados, pero hicieron lo que Jesús dijo, regresar a Galilea, específicamente a la montaña donde antes tuvieron una experiencia poderosa con él. Eso haría entendible que los discípulos fueran y estuvieran un poco recelosos o incrédulos.

TIENES ESTO

Ponte en los zapatos de los discípulos. Este es mayo, el tiempo de graduaciones, nuevos trabajos, nuevos carros, matrimonios y muchas otras transiciones que los jóvenes emprenden por sí mismos. Jesús les recuerda a los discípulos: “Dios me ha dado toda la autoridad, les he enseñado por tres años. Ahora ustedes tienen la autoridad. Vayan y hagan discípulos. Bauticen en el nombre de la Trinidad. Enséñenles lo que yo les enseñé”. Seguramente los discípulos estaban asustados, y Jesús debió haber sentido tanto miedo como orgullo. Este era el momento que sucede en todas las vidas. Era hora para que estos discípulos, estos estudiantes, sus “hijos” se hicieran los maestros. ¿Y cómo los tranquilizó? Como los padres, maestros y mentores lo han estado haciendo por siglos. Él sonrió y les recordó: “Por mi parte, yo estaré con ustedes todos los días, hasta el fin del mundo”. O quizá podríamos decir: “Tienes esto”.

CELEBRATING SUNDAY FOR CATHOLIC FAMILIES (Kara O'Malley)

This weekly guide is intended to help parents engage their children with the Mass and deepen their appreciation of the richness of their faith. The brief reflection on an excerpt of the Gospel is intended to spark your thinking about the Scripture with your family after Mass.

HEARING THE WORD: John 20:19-23 (Gospel on May 31, Pentecost Sunday)

REFLECTING ON THE WORD

It is now fifty days since Easter Sunday, and we complete our celebration of Easter with Pentecost (Pentecost means "fiftieth"). Notice that twice Jesus says, "Peace be with you" to the frightened disciples. In the same encounter, he gives them the power to forgive sins. Sin is a rupture in our relationship with God, with others and even with ourselves. It is difficult to experience peace when we are out of good or right relationship.

DISCUSS WITH YOUR FAMILY:

Today is another opportunity to reflect on the connection between the Gospel and the liturgy. Ask your children to notice what Jesus says to the disciples. When will they hear the same words in the Mass?

What is having peace like? What is it like to give and to receive peace?

LIVING THE WORD

On the feast of Pentecost, we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit and the institution of the Church. Punctuate your family's feast with touches of the color red: red roses, red table cloth, red cake with seven candles to signify the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit. Have your children make paper doves to decorate your prayer space. Pray the sequence for Pentecost (Veni, Sancte Spiritus) in English or Latin (or both!).

Hoy es otra oportunidad para reflexionar sobre la conexión entre el Evangelio y la liturgia. Pídale a sus hijos que se den cuenta de lo que Jesús les dice a los discípulos. ¿Cuándo escucharán las mismas palabras en la misa? ¿Que es tener paz? ¿Que es dar y recibir paz?

VIVIENDO LA PALABRA

En la fiesta de Pentecostés, celebramos la venida del Espíritu Santo y la institución de la Iglesia. Puntúe la fiesta de su familia con toques del color rojo: rosas rojas, manteles rojos, pastel rojo con siete velas para significar los siete dones del Espíritu Santo. Haga que sus hijos hagan palomas de papel para decorar su espacio de oración. Ore la secuencia de Pentecostés (Veni, Sancte Spiritus) en inglés o latín (¡o en ambos!).
