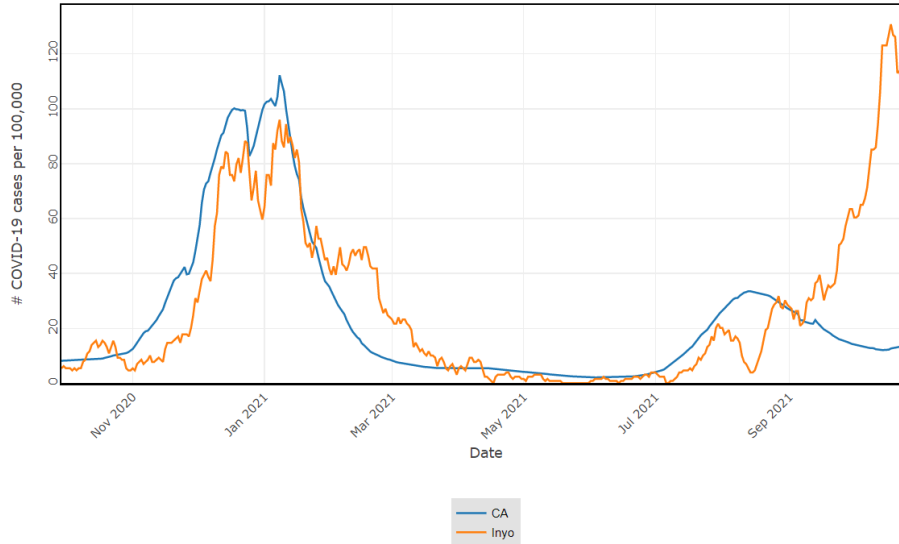

## Inyo County vs. California

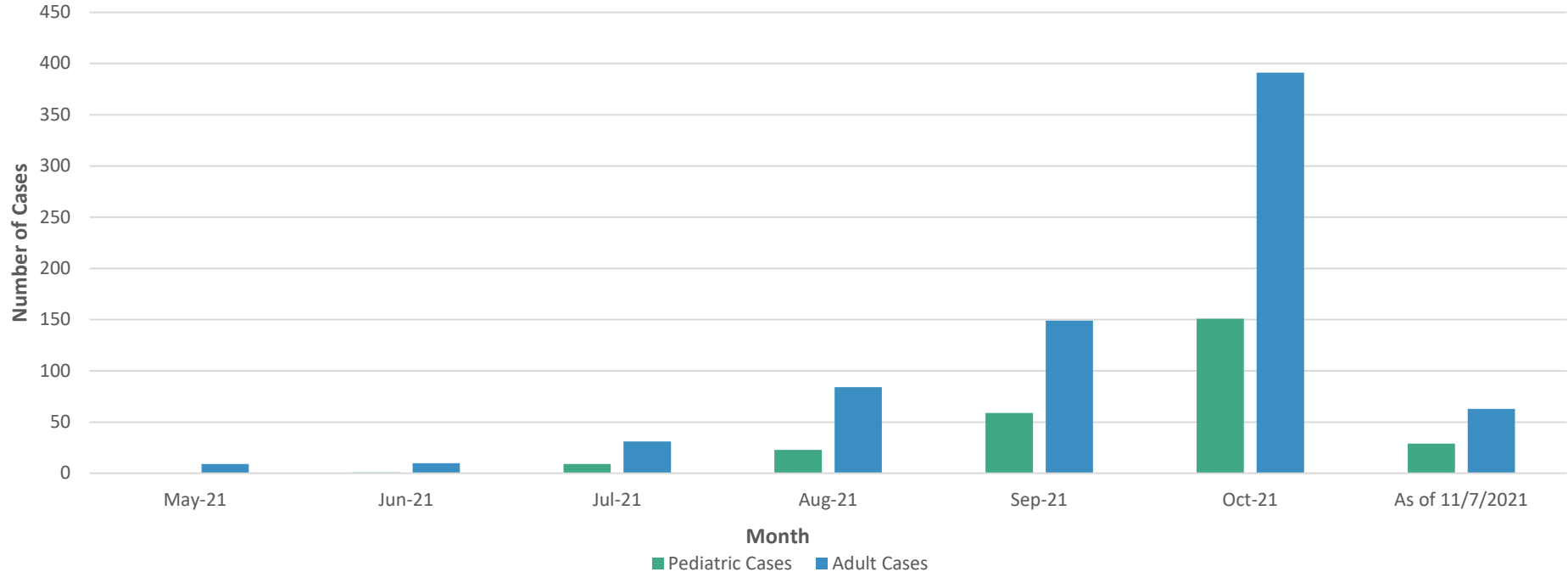
Case rate per 100,000 per day (7 day avg w/ 7 day lag) for

- Inyo County continues to log the highest case rate (94 per 100,000 people) and test positivity rate (20.7%) in California
- Over the last week we have continued to see a slightly lower number of cases, but continue to outpace case rates throughout California

## Inyo County vs. California

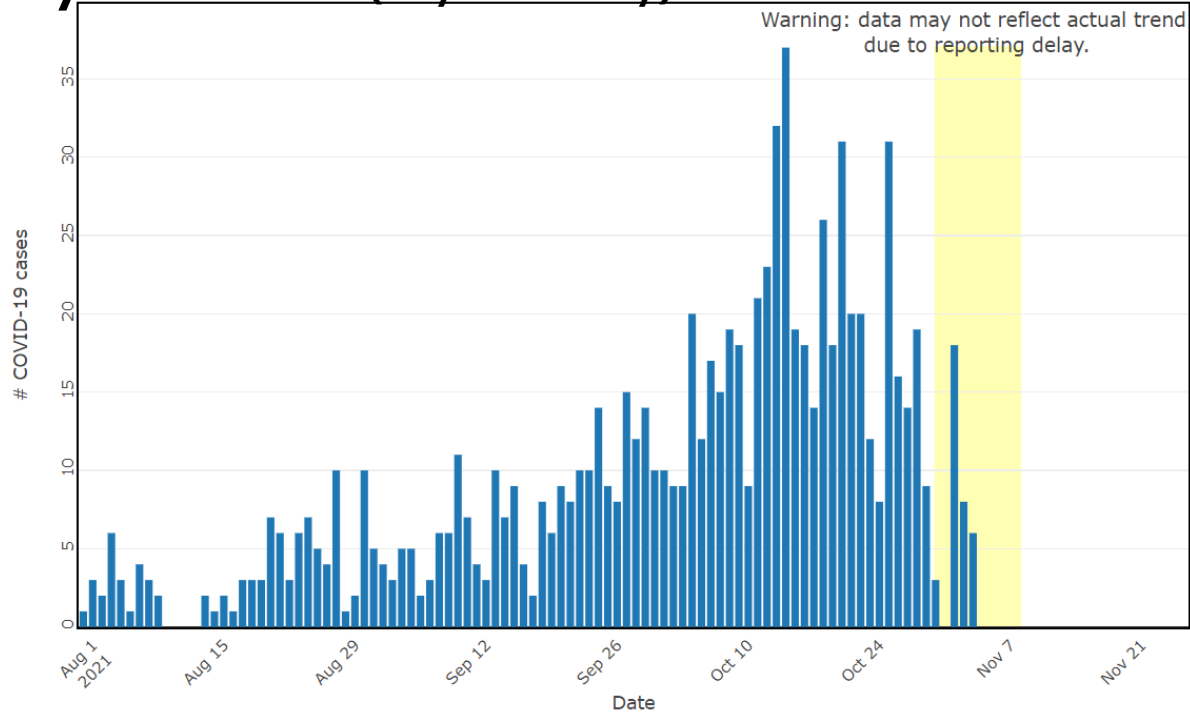
Tests per 100,000 per day (7 day avg w/ 7 day lag) for Multiple Locations



- Demand for testing has remained high through October into November 2021
  - Higher number of individuals seeking testing due to symptoms or referral from contact tracing
  - Required surveillance testing in some workplaces
- Working with CDPH/OptumServe to add a testing day in Bishop through December
  - Modified Hours of Operation: Testing this week will be modified to account for the Holiday on Thursday (Veterans Day)
- Testing in Bishop will be available: Monday & Wednesday

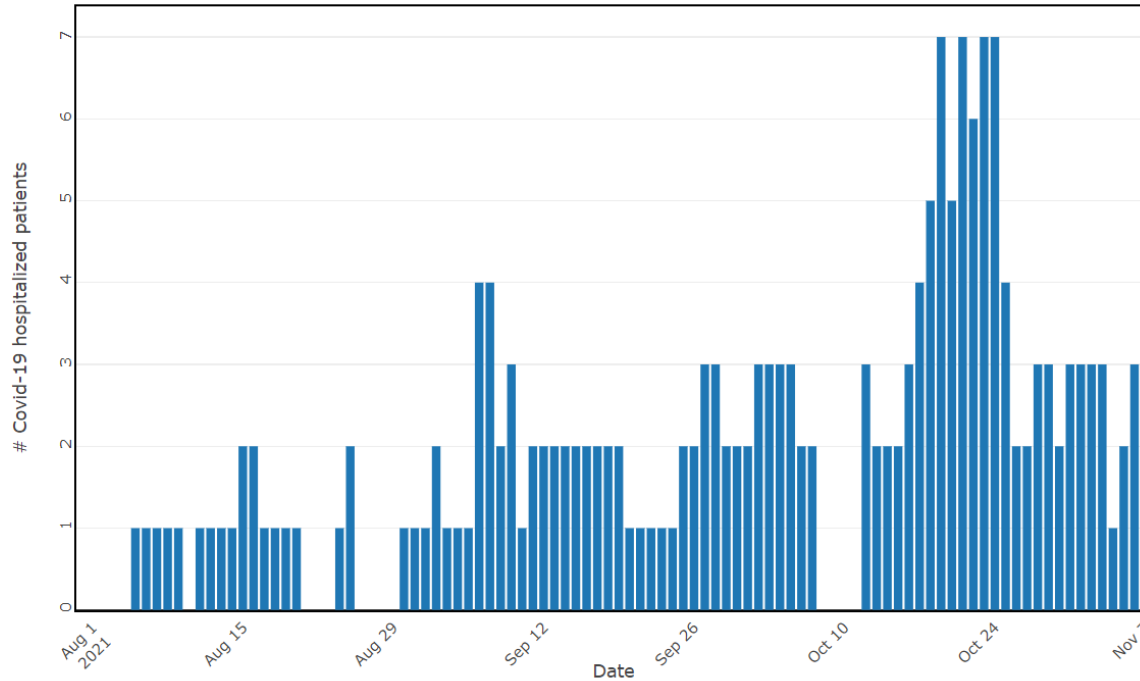

# Health Officer Order

## Universal Masking

### Current Orders and Guidance (CDPH):

- Mask required for all in certain indoor settings: healthcare, public transit, schools, correctional facilities, shelters, long term care and adult/senior care facilities
- Masks required for unvaccinated individuals in indoor public settings

### Local Health Officer Order:

- Instituted universal masking in indoor public settings to address high rate of COVID-19 transmission in Inyo County
- An effective mask has both good fit and good filtration. Good fit and filtration improve protection for others if you are infected and protection for you if you are exposed to an infected person.

July 2021: 12 cases | 29% of total July cases

August 2021: 22 cases | 19.6% of total August cases

September 2021: 23 cases | 11% of total September cases

October 2021: 30 cases | 5.5% of total October cases

- Suspect high percentage of breakthrough infections in July and August to be associated with Delta Variant outbreak in the county
- September and October breakthrough infections constitute a low percentage of total infections, especially considering the high transmission rates that we have had throughout both of those months
- Although these are estimates because we can't confirm 100% whether people are vaccinated, we can still extrapolate from our county-level data that vaccines are protective against infection and being unvaccinated puts our residents at higher risk for infection.

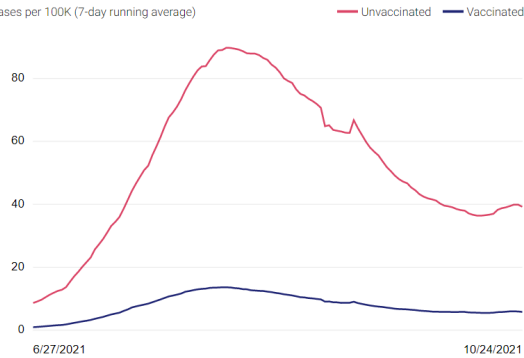

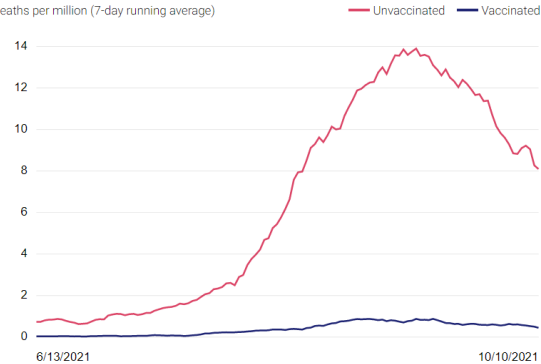


Cases per 100K (7-day running average)



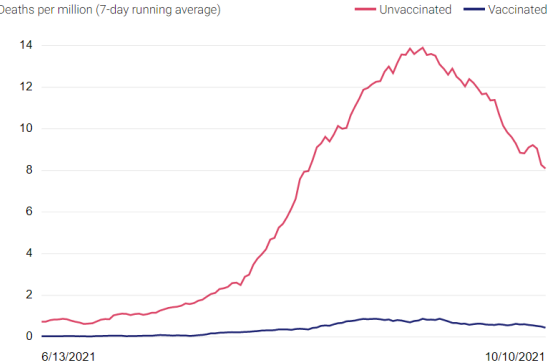
From October 18, 2021 to October 24, 2021, unvaccinated people were **6.8 times more likely** to get COVID-19 than fully vaccinated people.

Deaths per million (7-day running average)



From October 11, 2021 to October 17, 2021, unvaccinated people were **9.5 times more likely** to be hospitalized with COVID-19 than fully vaccinated people.

Deaths per million (7-day running average)



From October 4, 2021 to October 10, 2021, unvaccinated people were **18.2 times more likely** to die from COVID-19 than fully vaccinated people.

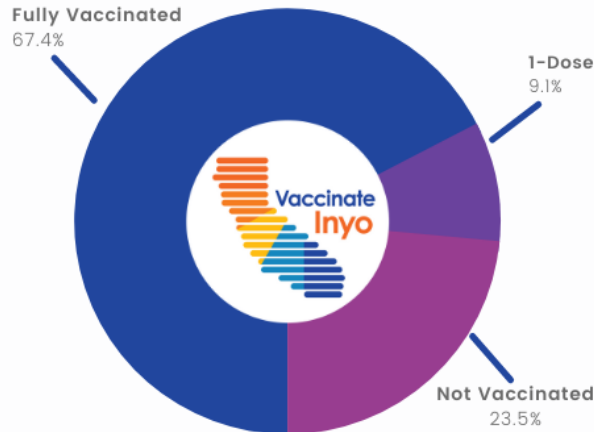

### Vaccinated Status Inyo County

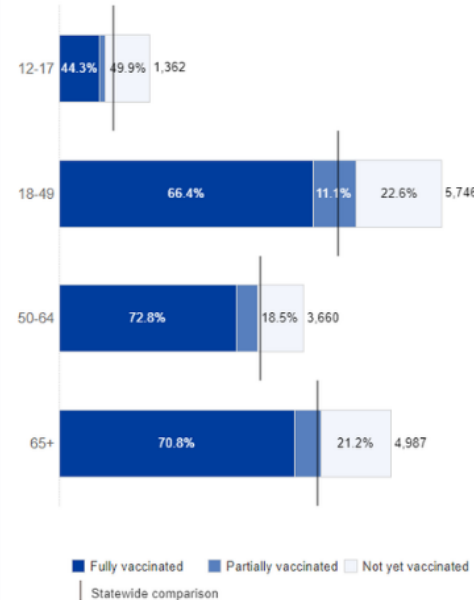
**Eligible Population\*: 15,755**

Approximately 1,000 more children in Inyo County became eligible to receive a COVID-19 vaccine when Pfizer's Pediatric COVID-19 vaccine received EUA approval

### Vaccine Coverage Note:

Beginning Wednesday, November 10, 2021, CDPH reports and dashboards showing the percentage of people vaccinated will be calculated using the number of people 5 years and older as the denominator, instead of the number of people 12 years and older.
