Significant Case Increases



- Significant increases in cases over past week is impacting our ability to complete contact tracing in a timely manner:
 - If positive, isolate for at least 5 days;
 - Notify people you have had close contact with in the past week and encourage them to test for COVID-19;
 - Following 5 day isolation period, re-test using an antigen test if available, before returning to work and other activities;
 - Wear a well fitting mask for next 5 days (N-95 or KN-95 preferred) anytime you are in contact with others;
 - Seek medical care right away if you are experiencing severe symptoms.

! Upgrade Your Mask

Get the Most out of Masking

Regardless of the mask type,
it is only effective if it is worn over your mouth and nose.

An effective mask has both **good fit** and **good filtration**. Good fit and filtration improve protection for others if you are infected and protection for you if you are exposed to an infected



Poor Fitting Mask: A poor fitting mask is not effective. If there are gaps between the face and mask, such as above the nose or at the sides, air that has virus particles can easily leak in or out around the sides of the mask.



Good Fitting Mask: An effective and well fitted mask has no gaps between the face and mask. **Good fit** forces the air that you breathe out and breathe in to go through the mask and be filtered. **Good filtration** blocks the virus particles from going through the mask itself.



(7 day avg. w/ 7 day lag) for: **Inyo** and **California**





- The test positivity rate in **California** is: **6.60%**


Case Trends - Inyo County

Treatment Options

Monoclonal Antibody Therapy & Antiviral Pills

- Some promising therapeutics, including **monoclonal antibody therapy** and **oral antiviral medications**, have received emergency use authorization for treatment of COVID-19.
 - However, these treatments and oral medications are in limited-to-no supply at this time, and Inyo County providers must prioritize these therapies for individuals at the highest risk for developing severe disease.
 - While supplies are limited, prescriptions for therapies will be available on a first-come, first-served basis for those who meet medical criteria.
 - Availability of these treatments is expected to steadily increase in the weeks ahead.
- If you have tested positive for COVID-19 and are at risk for developing severe symptoms due to your age or underlying health conditions, talk to your doctor about what available treatments may be right for you.


COVID-19 Vaccine

*Percent of people that are either partially/fully vaccinated through state & federal entities out of the estimated 5+ population



Vaccinated Status by Age




COVID-19 Vaccine Effectiveness - California



From December 13, 2021 to December 19, 2021, unvaccinated people were **5.2x more likely to get COVID-19** than fully vaccinated people.



From December 6, 2021 to December 12, 2021, unvaccinated people were **14.5x more likely to be hospitalized** with COVID-19 than fully vaccinated people.



From November 29, 2021 to December 5, 2021, unvaccinated people were **15.0x more likely to die** from COVID-19 than fully vaccinated people.
