BOARD OF ELECTIONS



WOULD YOU LIKE TO BE AN ELECTION JUDGE?



Election Judges who operate the polling places play a very important role in the electoral process. The Judges act as liaisons between the Election Office and the general public during voting day hours and are responsible for administering the actual voting procedures in each precinct. Without these individuals, it would be impossible to conduct an election.

The ideal Election Judge should be able to endure long hours on Election Day and deal courteously and patiently with the public and co-workers. Additionally, Judges must ensure that qualified voters who are properly registered are able to cast their vote in a trouble-free environment. Election Judges represents the Board of Elections process during the election. Therefore, the Election Judge must be reliable, courteous, able to follow procedures, and above all, possess good judgment.

QUALIFICATIONS

- 18 years of age or older.
- Are a registered voter in the state of Maryland.
- Physically and mentally able to work a 15-hour day.
- Must be a U.S. Citizen.
- Willing to work outside your home precinct.
- Must be able to lift a minimum of 35 pounds.
- Able to sit and/or stand for an extended period; and
- Can speak, read and write English.

Training Sessions for the Judges

Maryland law requires anyone who desires to become an Election Judge **must** attend a training session as a condition of appointment. You may be required to pass a written and/or hands on evaluation in order to work. Even though an individual may have served many years as a Judge, it is necessary to review the laws and procedures that govern elections before every primary election. Each year the General Assembly of Maryland passes many bills that change the way elections are conducted. An informed Election Judge eliminates the possibility of errors in the operation of a polling place on Election Day.

Compensation

Each day a Judge works they will be paid the following:

- Chief Judges receive **\$400**
- Election Judges receive **\$300**
- Provisional/Same Day Registration Judges receive **\$300**
- Closing Judges receive **\$100**

All Judges receive **\$50** for attending the training session. If you do not participate on election day you **will not be paid for training.**

Application Procedures

2. You will be contacted by an Election Judge Recruiter to schedule a training session
3. You will receive a letter indicating acceptance of the appointment. This letter will also state the required oath to be taken by an Election Judge. You cannot be appointed to the position until the oath is returned to the Election Office.

Opportunities for High School Students

Qualifications

The minor (who is not a registered voter) must demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Prince George's County Board of Elections that he or she meets the qualification for registration in the county.

Registration & Status

Students may register to vote if they are at least 16 years old but cannot vote unless you will be at least 18 years old by the next general election

Student Independent Service Learning

Students may elect to earn Student Independent Service Learning hours in lieu of payment

Work Hours

If selected to serve, Student Judges only work 12 hours, between 6 am and 6 pm.
