Funding Opportunities:

[Abandoned Mine Land \(AML\) Pilot Grant](#)

This grant opportunity provides \$25 million in funding for the reclamation of abandoned mine lands in conjunction with economic and community development reuse goals. “The funding provides opportunities to transform abandoned mine lands, creating economic opportunity, and transitioning our coal communities to a new and brighter future,” said DEP Secretary Patrick McDonnell. Applications will be accepted until 4:00 PM on Friday, January 31, 2020.

Supports community-driven solutions that address environmental and/or public health issues for underserved communities, including minority, Tribal, low income, rural and homeless populations. Apply to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) by February 7, 2020.

[Food Recovery Infrastructure Grant](#)

These grants of up to \$200,000 provide assistance to eligible nonprofit organizations such as shelters and food banks for proper food management. “Access to fresh food in underserved communities is a public health and quality of life issue, but it’s also an environmental justice issue. While traveling across the state, my staff and I often hear from underserved communities that access to fresh food is a significant concern, so we wanted to do our part to address this issue in a meaningful, environmentally focused way,” said DEP Secretary Patrick McDonnell. The grant application deadline is April 24, 2020.
