Dr. Mario has experience in all levels of care related to substance use disorders including inpatient medical withdrawal management, residential treatment and outpatient (Intensive Outpatient, Partial-Hospitalization and medical office addiction medicine). Dr. Mario has served as founding Director for the Memorial Care Addiction Medicine Unit and has held directorships for several residential and outpatient treatment organizations. Dr. Mario is a certified Medical Review Officer and has been an active and passionate advocate for people with substance use disorders through leadership at the local, state and national level and enjoys teaching students and colleagues about Addiction Medicine. Dr. Mario serves as the vice chair of the American Society of Addiction Medicine Practice Management and Regulatory Affairs Committee and also serves on the California Society of Addiction Medicine’s Public Policy Committee and Board of Directors. Dr. Mario has been active in helping craft various policies involving substance use treatment and remains clinically active in direct patient care involving substance use disorders for vulnerable populations.
