## **Gifts for YOU!**

The ADSOEF/OSO Scholarship Committee is urging any chapter member doing graduate study or continuing education to seriously consider applying for the Annie Webb Blanton Scholarship, which can be used at any accredited university, the Margaret L. White Scholarship at The Ohio State University, The Ruth Grimes Scholarship at Miami University and the Florence L. Woodward Scholarship at Kent State University. The A. Margaret Boyd International Study Fellowship for an Ohio member wanting to do a yearlong study abroad is also available. The course of study for this fellowship must be affiliated with an accredited university.

These scholarship and fellowship applications can be found on the ADSOEF website <https://adsoef.weebly.com/forms--applications.html> and are **due January 1, 2020**.

The Individual/Classroom/Community Project Fund provides support to members of Ohio State Organization who plan and provide leadership for a program that will enhance the education of students, educators, or community members. (There now **NO due date** for Individual/Classroom/Community Project applications!)

You can also apply for an International DKG Scholarship which is **due February 1, 2020**. International offers more than twenty scholarships for our members and gives up to \$6,000.00 for graduate study and \$10,000.00 for a doctorate study course. To qualify for the International scholarship an individual must be an active chapter member for three years. Also, International offers the Lucille Cornetet Individual Awards for Professional Development. This award is available to all employed educators whether they are a DKG member or non-member. This award can be awarded for conferences, seminars, lecture series, National certification, up to \$1,000.00 for National Board Certification, online courses, workshops and other non-degree programs. The application for each of these International scholarships is on the International website, which is **dkg.org**. We really would like to see Ohio names on this list!

We look forward to seeing Ohio members receive scholarships at both the State and International levels!

### **EDUCATIONAL EXCELLENCE COMMITTEE:**

During the month of December, we will continue to focus on our second objective which is to gain and acquire facts about our Foster Care initiative which is the word **Knowledge**.

Share this **Knowledge** about the Foster Care Process with members in your OSO Chapter during your monthly meetings so that they are provided with these important facts.

#### **Did You Know That....**

- There are 19,000 Foster Children/Youth in Ohio. The majority of those children/youth are placed into Foster Care due to neglect, physical abuse, parental substance abuse or abandonment concerns.

- Almost 40% of children/youth in Foster Care will remain in Foster Care for more than 2 years; Nearly one fourth of the children/youth who are in Foster Care environments will experience three or more placements while in care.
- When children/youth are removed from unsafe environments and are placed in temporary Foster Care placement about 80% have no medical information and have few or no personal items to transport with them.
- As we approach this Holiday season, Children in Foster Care sometimes feel the separation from their biological families. Your Chapter might want to explore and investigate ways that they can share with children and youth who are in Foster Care environments by sending gloves, hats, socks, books, scarfs or other items to a Salvation Army or a Foster Care Agency in your area.

Continue to watch for more facts about 'Foster Care in Ohio' next month so that we can continue to gain and acquire information about the needs of children and youth in our communities.

## MEMBERSHIP

Have you heard about the **Buckeye-Cherry Membership Challenge**? The Ohio State and Michigan State Organization representatives attended DKG Leadership Development in Des Moines, Iowa this summer and our state president, Diana Kirkpatrick had an idea for a membership challenge between the two states. During a breakfast meeting, the two teams developed a plan. The goal is to see which organization can increase membership by the greatest percentage. Are you up for the challenge? To help OSO be declared the winner, continue reading the article for more information.

- To grow chapter membership, the Ohio State Organization leadership team initiated a membership challenge with the members of Michigan State Organization. The team with the most, new members by percentage will be declared the winner. The losing team will donate \$100 to the DKG Educational Foundation in the name of the winner.
- **The Buckeye-Cherry Membership Challenge** officially began **September 1, 2019**, and ends **September 1, 2020**, with an extension to **March 1, 2021**.
- We challenge chapters to make use of Ohio's 3 R's of Membership:  
**Retain** your current chapter memberships;  
**Recruit** new members utilizing the **DKG Membership Recruitment Plan**; and **Reinstate** former chapter members
- Varying point values can be earned for inducting new members, reinstating former chapter members, receiving transfer memberships, and completing the Buckeye-Cherry Membership Challenge Survey and Recognition Form. (For point values, refer to the information listed on the "tree" handout of the challenge.)

- Chapters receiving 1 to 4 points will be **recognized** at the 2021 OSO Convention and announced in the May 2021 edition of The Voice.
- Chapters earning 5 points, or more will be **honored** at the 2021 OSO Convention and announced in the May 2021 edition of The Voice. There will also be additional recognitions for 10- and 15-point categories.
- To receive chapter recognition in the **honored (5 points or more)** or **recognized (1 to 4 points)** categories, it will be the responsibility of the chapter president to complete the Buckeye-Cherry Membership Challenge Survey and Recognition Form (available on the OSO website October 1, 2020) and send to Membership Chair, Debby Canter, 309 N. 
