As one of her initiatives, our OSO President Debby Canter is spotlighting a project called "The Delta Kappa Gamma Patch." It's an opportunity for chapters to pair up with Girl Scout Troops to teach leadership, do projects, serve the community, and have fun, all while illustrating the seven purposes of Delta Kappa Gamma to a younger generation.

Originating in San Antonio, Texas, The Delta Kappa Gamma Patch started with collaboration between the Zeta Beta Chapter, their local Girl Scout Council, and two local Girl Scout troops. They put together a planned and methodical curriculum that includes joint activities, each with a theme that corresponds to one of the seven DKG purposes. Girls at different ages and scouting levels complete different amounts of activities to earn the patch.

We are looking for several chapters to pilot this idea in Ohio. The key idea is to start with a troop that has roots in your organization. The more connections or "roots" to your chapter, the more buy-in you are likely to get. The original curriculum, found online, has 18 activities already written you can use it, as-is, or just use it as a framework to write your own.
