

## Leap into Leadership

The entire OSO Admin Team will be making separate presentations on a wide range of topics throughout the scheduled seminar. My PowerPoint presentation is titled, "Leap into Leadership." I want the content to be a surprise yet tickle your curiosity bone in this column.

Have you ever leapt into something not knowing what the result may be? I have on countless occasions. If truth be told I thrive on it and still do. These leaps are simultaneously exhilarating and frightening. ### DKG International Convention, July 9 – 13, 2024

DKG members from around the world will gather in National Harbor, Maryland for a magnificent week of personal and professional opportunities, the business of voting on 94 proposed amendments to the Constitution and Standing Rules and the celebration of installing new officers. The proposed amendments are easily found by visiting www.dkg.org. Amendments that are adopted will become effective on July 13, 2024. The impact of these governance changes will be reflected in updated Ohio Bylaws and Rules and in Chapter Rules.

Motions not related to the amendments will also be considered by those attending the convention. The International Educational Excellence Committee will bring to the floor a resolution to replace UNICEF Schools for Africa with GIRLS (Girls Initiative to Revitalize Learning Success). The mission of GIRLS is to make progress in the education of girls in Africa and prioritize efforts to enable all girls to complete secondary education and develop life skills.

A second motion will be made that a member task force work in collaboration with legal counsel to develop shorter and simpler bylaws for consideration and possible adoption at the 2026 International Convention. These bylaws, if adopted, would replace the Constitution and the current governing documents.
