What do the American Heritage Girls do?

AHG offers a faith-based scouting program supported by St. Junipero Serra Catholic School. We focus on both service and badge activities.

- Girls at the youngest ages are earning badges in six frontiers for a well-balanced scouting experience. The frontiers are the Heritage Frontier, the Family Living Frontier, the Arts Frontier, the Outdoor Skills Frontier, the Personal Well-being Frontier, and the Science and Technology Frontier.
- Activities include campouts, hikes, badge projects, Father-Daughter / Mother-Daughter events, and other social and family-oriented activities, which are planned throughout the year.
- The troop is K-12, where older girls mentor the younger girls throughout their experience in AHG.
- Troop 818 meets once per month for troop-wide and squad meetings. Outings, field trips, or special badge work may be held on weekends.
- Scouting is flexible. If you cannot make a meeting, the activities in the handbooks may be completed as a family. Girls are encouraged to earn badges of their interest and leaders help plan so that girls may complete their bridging and level award requirements.
- The Stars and Stripes Award is being recognized by colleges for scholarships and at the career-level.
- Leaders are registered with AHG National and go through background checks and KEYS Youth Protection Training. SJSC service hours may be earned by helping with AHG.
