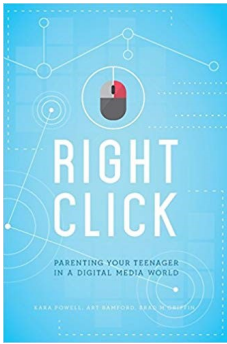

Right Click helps you think and talk differently about digital media, as you learn from inspiring and

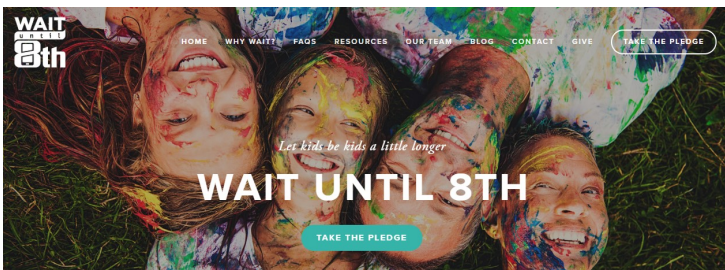
creative parents like you who navigate these ever-changing waters day after day. Approach this new connected world like a team and address your most pressing tech related dilemmas.

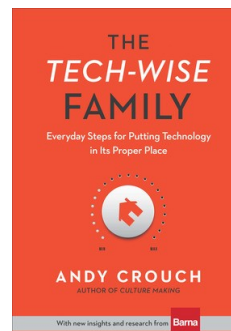
