We at St. Mark's stand with Wesley in these commitments.

# adult sunday school classes

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## PILGRIMS

In September, Pilgrims Class is using Dr Amy-Jill Levine's video lecture series titled **Great Figures of the New Testament** to look at some famous and some not so famous figures in the Bible.

Depending on the needs and interests of the evangelists and their communities, these figures of the earliest years of the church have been remembered in various ways. What one Gospel chose to highlight, another ignores and what one canonical text mentions in passing, later tradition substantially develops. In the next few weeks, Dr Levine's lecture topics include: Judas Iscariot, Pontius Pilate, James, Stephen, Philip and the Centurions.

Pilgrims meets in Room 12 at 9:15AM on Sunday morning. We welcome any and all at any point in the lectures series for the presentation and resulting discussions.

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## NOMADS

The Nomads class will continue discussing a new book by Barbara Brown Taylor, who has served as an Episcopal priest, teacher, and as a professor on the faculties of Piedmont College, Columbia Theological Seminary, Candler School of Theology at Emory University, McAfee School of Theology at Mercer University, and in the Certificate in Theological Studies program at Arrendale State Prison for Women in Alto, Georgia. This book, entitled **HOLY ENVY: FINDING GOD IN THE FAITH OF OTHERS**, is based on the author's experiences "teaching the world's religions to undergraduates in Baptist-saturated rural Georgia, revealing how God delights in confounding our expectations." All are welcome to join our informal discussions, even without reading along in the book. We meet in room 8 at 9:30. *On September 29, the class will be participating in the Update and Conversation with Mark Cox and Mary Beth Morgan.*

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## BIBLE BANTER

The Bible Banter class uses the Scripture text for the morning's sermon as a discussion-starter. Looking at the passage in its larger context, and sometimes exploring a bit of Bible-writing history, we offer thoughts on what the morning's sermon might look like, based on the Scripture the pastor has selected. We leave time to discuss implications of the Scripture on our own lives, and often find ourselves delving into topics that wind up far afield from the morning's original topic.
