SAMHSA COVID Self-Care Training Series

In response to COVID-19, SAMHSA provided Coordinated Behavioral Care with a two million dollar grant to help address the immense unmet mental health needs in NYS. SAMHSA recognized that front line staff, especially those providing behavioral health services, also need support to address their personal and professional experiences with COVID-19. CBC has developed the COVID Self-Care Training Series in response to that gap and as a support for front line staff, in collaboration with The Bridge, CUCS, WellLife, OHEL, and the Kripalu Center. The overall theme of the trainings is *professional self-care*. Through these trainings, agency staff will have the opportunity to master self-care skills, share experiences and process their fears, concerns and anxieties as they provide care during a pandemic.

Between January and August of 2021, agency staff will have the option to select from a large menu of webinars to support their wellbeing. The first month of trainings is listed here. We hope that you and your staff take advantage of this incredible opportunity to deepen your/ their own self-care practices.

Coping With COVID-19: Response and Recovery **January 11th, 2021 9:30 am- 11am**

Training Description- This training will provide a forum for discussing and managing the challenges and stressors brought on by Covid-19. The training will recognize how the pandemic, which has hit New York City very hard and has put our lives under large and continuing amounts of stress, makes our important work more challenging than ever. The training will review many of the coping and wellness skills we teach our clients with the goal of helping workers stay safe.

Trainer: **James Kennedy, LCSW**, is the CUCS Institute Director of Training. Mr. Kennedy has over 25 years of experience in program development and social service delivery in the areas of housing, HIV/AIDS, chemical dependence, employment, entitlements, and advocacy. He currently trains and provides program implementation support and coaching to numerous nonprofit and government agencies nationally on topics relating to mental health, case management approaches, supervision techniques, and homelessness. He has also develops curriculum, delivers trainings and provides implementation support and coaching on several Evidence-Based Practices, including Motivational Interviewing (MI), Critical Time Intervention (CTI), Supported Employment (SE) and Wellness Self Management (WSM). Prior to joining the Institute, Mr. Kennedy conducted case management and team supervision in two large permanent supportive housing programs serving formerly homeless adults and families. Mr. Kennedy has a BA in psychology from City College, City University of New York (CUNY) and a Master's Degree in Social Work from Fordham University School of Social Work. He also completed a candidacy in Four-Year Analytic Program at the Institute for Contemporary Psychotherapy (ICP) and worked as a psychotherapist and analyst.

Organizational Ways to Promote Self- Care due to COVID-19 (For Supervisors and Managers)

January 14th, 2021 9:30am-11am

Trainer: **James Kennedy, LCSW**

Training Description- This training is for managers and supervisors to provide an overview of stress in social services. It will also illustrate principles for management to help reduce job concerns and to cope effectively with the stressors/ challenges due to the pandemic. Participants will develop awareness of the impact of new tensions and issues (additional cultural and demographic contexts). We will review organizational issues to address challenges for supervisors, while providing self-care and practical coping skills and tips for workers.



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SAMHSA COVID Self-Care Training Series

Grief and Loss January 21, 2021 9:30am-11am

Trainer: Dr. Norman Blumenthal, OHEL

Training Description -Grief is a normal, expected and necessary response to the death of a loved one such as a family member or dear friend. The inevitable sadness, psychic pain and longing for reconnection needs to be processed by the bereaved and validated by those invested in her ultimate consolation. This workshop will convey the universality and function of grief with specific suggestions how both the bereaved and his associates can facilitate the effective expression of loss and pain. This will be accomplished through presentation, discussion, voluntary sharing and exercises.

Trainer: Dr. Norman Blumenthal, OHEL - is a licensed clinical psychologist in New York who received his doctorate from Adelphi University. With over twenty years' experience in trauma and bereavement services, he currently serves as the Zachter Family Director of Trauma and Crisis Intervention for OHEL Children's Home and Family Services and an Adjunct Professor at the Ferkauf Graduate School of Psychology at Yeshiva University. Dr. Blumenthal and his team regularly address the survivors of trauma including the Hurricane Sandy, Houston Floods, Pittsburgh shooting and the like. Most recently, Dr. Blumenthal has been in the forefront of Covid-19 trauma response, leading support groups for bereaved family members, running school workshops and community education programs. In addition, Dr. Blumenthal is an instructor in group psychotherapy at Zucker Hillside Hospital of the Northwell Health System in Glen Oaks, New York and consultant for the TOVA mentoring program in Cedarhurst New York.

Trauma January 25, 2021 9:30am-11am

Trainer: Dr. Norman Blumenthal, OHEL

Training Description- Trauma occurs when the predictability and stability of one's life is challenged and shattered by an event or series of events that pose a serious threat to the individual's survival or capacity to adequately function. The responses of the traumatized is often heightened levels of fear, anxiety or conversely numbness or withdrawal that may feel destabilizing. In this workshop, the participants will be familiarized with the different types of trauma with a particular focus on the current pandemic. Methods of relieving the adverse effects of trauma and effectively adjusting to ongoing traumatic situations will be both discussed and practiced.

Interview with Celia Brown, NY's 1st Peer Specialist

January 7, 2021 10:30am-11:30am

Trainer: **Celia Brown** is a psychiatric survivor who was instrumental in developing the peer specialist civil service title in the country and first peer specialist in NYS. Celia is the Regional Advocacy Specialist at the NYC Field Office, New York State Office of Mental Health. She provides technical assistance and support to people with psychiatric disabilities and their families. Celia facilitates trainings on peer support and wellness and recovery approaches in community mental health agencies. Celia is a long-time leader in the peer movement. She's a member of the Healing and Hip Hop team and uses her experiences of recovery. She has her NYS peer certification. Celia has utilized her knowledge around food and wellness to improve her own physical health.

Introduction to Dialectical Behavior Therapy (DBT)

January 26, 2021 2:00pm-3:30pm

Trainers: **Emily Grossman, MA, CPRP** and **Dr. Bianca Nguyen**

Training Description- In this webinar, participants will get a chance to learn about Dialectical Behavior Therapy. The webinar is meant to be an overview of this evidenced-based approach, which was developed by Dr. Marsha Linehan. While participants will not be trained to deliver DBT after this training, they will get a good sense of what DBT is, its uses, and how it can benefit the people they serve. The training will look at DBT from both the provider perspective, as presented by psychiatrist Dr. Bianca Nguyen, and also from a service recipient's perspective, as presented by CBC Training Institute Director Emily Grossman. This webinar will be very informative and hands on. You won't want to miss it!

Trainers: **Emily Grossman, MA, CPRP**, is the Director of the CBC Training Institute. She has worked in mental health for the last decade, beginning on the "front lines" as a Peer Specialist in community mental health in NJ. After several years, she transitioned to doing mental health provider training and systems change work at large organizations such as The Jewish Board, Columbia's Center for Practice Innovations, and the New York Association of Psychiatric Rehabilitation Services (NYAPRS). In 2018, she was the winner of the National Council for Behavioral Health's prestigious "Peer Specialist of the Year" Award. Emily frequently speaks nationally on topics such as peer support and mental health recovery. She holds a Master's in Education from Columbia University.

Dr. Bianca Nguyen, is a Public Psychiatry Fellow at Columbia / New York State Psychiatric Institute and recently joined the CBC team in July 2020 as part of her fellowship. She is a graduate of the adult psychiatry residency program at Columbia, where she served as Chief Resident. During residency, she deepened interests in teaching and medical education, focusing research and writing on psychiatry training, especially as it pertains to integrated care and improving the physical health of patients with severe mental illness. She received her dual MD/MPH degree from Tufts University School of Medicine.

Project ECHO: Substance Use Disorder & MAT Treatment Call

January 27, 2021 10am-11:30am

PROJECT ECHO is a method of sharing knowledge through a video conferencing learning collaborative. The approach focuses on case presentations and recommendations from colleagues in the field and a subject matter expert. In addition to case presentations there is also a brief didactic learning session by the subject matter expert, Dr. Bruce Trigg, who has many years of experience in treating patients with and consulting on Substance Use Disorder. This is an excellent opportunity for prescribers and other mental health professionals in the field to learn about how to best to support clients with Substance Use and Mental Health Disorders. Health Home Virtual Office Hours


