

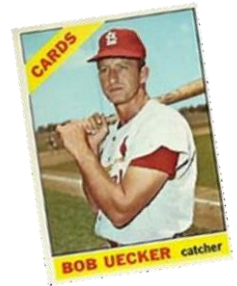


## Uecker's life and legacy: BASEBALL'S Bob Uecker's Life

He has also contributed to the Pro Football Researchers Association. He and his wife Debbie live in St. Francis, Wisconsin.
