Synchronous Learning - When students participate in learning activities with real-time (live) teacher interaction. Examples include: Utilizing Conferences Schoology tool for Socratic seminar, group discussions, small group collaboration and check for understanding.

Asynchronous Learning - When students participate in learning activities in a self-directed manner without real-time teacher interaction. Examples include: Reading & annotating a passage or watching an instructional video.



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Remote Learning Phase - When 100% of Cienega students receive mastery level instruction using an online platform while in a setting outside of Cienega's campus.

Synchronous Learning - When students participate in learning activities with real-time (live) teacher interaction. Examples include: Utilizing Conferences tool for Socratic seminar, group discussions, small group collaboration and check for understanding.

Asynchronous Learning - When students participate in learning activities in a self-directed manner without real-time teacher interaction. Examples include: Reading & annotating a passage or watching an instructional video.

Conferencing - A Schoology video-conferencing tool that allows students to interact with their teacher and classmates in real-time.

Schoology - The universal platform that all Cienega teachers will use to deliver instructions and content.

PowerSchool - The universal online platform that all Cienega teachers will use to record student grades, attendance and tardies. Families are highly encouraged to use this tool to check real-time grades and attendance for their students.

VIC - Vail Innovation Center - An online Vail USD school that has been providing 100% online learning utilizing Vail teachers for years.

Remote Learning Etiquette Ideas for Students

- Student Response- you must post a "meaningful response" of at least 40 words (graphs and pictures can be included but do not alone constitute a response). Draw vocabulary from the discussion question for best response.
- Student Response- you must give two meaningful replies to two other students' responses. The replies should be positive and encouraging in nature. A "meaningful response" shows you understand the topic and demonstrates thought and insight into the question(s).
- Behavior: Maintain the same standard of behavior and ethics that you would follow in a face-to-face context.
- Tone: Treat others with respect. Be mindful of your tone and how that is conveyed in your writing style. DO NOT USE ALL CAPS. It is considered shouting and not appropriate in a classroom. Avoid sarcasm and irony as it is easily misinterpreted in an online environment.
- Clarity and Content: Be succinct. Write, reread, and then post. Carefully consider what you have written. Does it make sense? Is it free from errors? Does it add to the conversation? Is it unnecessarily confrontational or offensive?
- Contribute: Online learning is not passive. It is expected that you will share your knowledge and insight. Be an active contributor to the learning community.
- Be forgiving: If someone makes a mistake or does something inappropriate, address it privately and politely. You can always let the instructor know and ask them to address it as well.
