

Rearranged Our Collection

Normally, weeding our collection is an ongoing process completed throughout the year. But we took this opportunity to weed our entire Youth Services collection, rearrange the location of materials to highlight new items, and added more new materials. Return Your Materials to the Library

The library's vestibule/entryway will be open on certain days and times:

Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays and Saturdays

10 AM - 1 PM

Tuesdays and Thursdays

4 PM - 6 PM

All materials returned to the library will be quarantined a minimum of 72 hours. Why three days? This is based on the most recent scientific data regarding the "life" of the coronavirus on paper, cardboard, and plastic. Materials will be checked in after the quarantine; no fines will be imposed at this time.

Safety Guidelines

The library has instituted the following guidelines to ensure safety in the library during the COVID-19 crisis:

- Hygiene procedures for cleaning/disinfecting common areas
- Requiring staff to wear protective gear, such as masks, while administering services
- Encouraging staff to monitor for symptoms of the virus and/or testing, if needed
- Health and hygiene reminders posted
